

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Peace!

I would like to express my gratitude to all of you for your support and prayers for the success of the Parish Pastoral Assembly last Sunday, June 6, 2010. It went well. The first two proposal, were ratified and approved unanimously. The third proposal on the placement of the tabernacle was not unanimous, however the proposal was approved by the majority. For me this is a good sign. It makes our parish alive and growing. Growth always comes with pain. We may not agree on many things on reaching an important decision (such as the placement of the tabernacle) but we can discuss issues openly without fear and still respect and love one another. This is the essence of our parish/community life. Discernment is a gradual and a painful process. We need to follow the lead of the Holy Spirit.

The Parish Pastoral Program for 2010 to 2015 will be submitted to Bishop Larry Silva. This will also take effect this July, 2010. Let us be one as a parish community to support this program so that we may achieve the goals of the Diocesan Roadmap.

In our Gospel this Sunday we hear Jesus telling the sinful woman, "Your sins are forgiven, your faith has saved you; go in peace." Jesus loves sinners who approach him in faith and devotion. He will readily extend his forgiveness, peace, and salvation. This is a consolation and a joy for all of us knowing that we are all imperfect and need God's salvation.

# **Sunday Reflection**

## Father Greg Friedman, O.F.M.

## 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time | June 13, 2010

2 Sam 12:7-10,13, Ps 32:1-2, 5, 7, 11; Gal 2:16, 19-21, Lk 7:36--8:3

Mary Magdalene is one of the New Testament's most interesting characters—as well as someone whose reputation has been tainted by mistaken identity. Today's Gospel story is a good place to begin correcting that misinformation.



From Luke's Gospel, we hear a story of a dramatic banquet at a Pharisee's house. There, a woman of sinful reputation enters and performs the gesture of bathing Jesus' feet with her tears, wiping them with her hair and anointing them with ointment. When the host is scandalized, Jesus uses the incident to remark about the woman's great love, and then goes on to forgive her.

Later in the same Gospel passage, we hear that as Jesus journeys about preaching Good News, his company included some "women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities," including "Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out." It's clear from the text that the two women in the story are different individuals.

Mary Magdalene is portrayed in today's account as a follower of Christ—one who was in his company of believers, and who—in John's resurrection story—was an eyewitness to Jesus risen, and a messenger of that wonderful Good News to the apostles. Mary's role is one of Christian service and witness—a role we can do well to imitate.




