

Pastor's Corner

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

We all want to be happy. We all want to achieve Fullness of Life. Jesus, in this Sunday's Gospel offers us the Beatitudes. Let us look at the Catechism of the Catholic Church and what it says about this important teaching of the Lord.

- 1. CCC 1725: The Beatitudes take up and fulfill God's promises from Abraham on by ordering them to the Kingdom of heaven. They respond to the desire for happiness that God has placed in the human heart.
- 2. CCC 1726: The Beatitudes teach us the final end to which God calls us: the Kingdom, the vision of God, participation in the divine nature, eternal life, filiation, rest in God.
- 3. CCC 1727: The beatitude of eternal life is a gratuitous gift of God. It is supernatural, as is the grace that leads us there.
- 4. CCC 1728: The Beatitudes confront us with decisive choices concerning earthly goods; they purify our hearts in order to teach us to love God above all things.

We celebrate Catholic Schools Week (January 30-February 5, 2011). Let us pray for the intention of St. Joseph Schools, especially for our parishioners, benefactors, parents, teachers and for all who support Catholic Education. May our Good Lord bless us so that St. Joseph Parish may continue the work of Evangelization, teaching the Beatitudes through Catholic Education.

This Wednesday, February 2, we will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. This is a good time for us to consecrate our lives to God. We all belong to him. Let us, in turn, give ourselves to him by living the Beatitudes.

Saint Peter Julian Eymard, whose 200th birthday will be celebrated this 4th of February had seen and experienced God's unconditional love in Jesus' offering of himself to the Father and to humanity. In gratitude for this he offered his very self to Jesus in the Eucharist. He said, "I must be to Jesus what Jesus is to the Father".
