Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

Last Monday, November 14, we concluded the nine day novena for our beloved dead with the celebration of the Eucharist. This tradition of praying for our deceased brothers and sisters is in line with what is taught in the Scriptures, namely, "that it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be freed from their sins". (2 Maccabees 12: 45ff).

Jesus declared himself "the resurrection and the life." This teaching is confirmed by his true resurrection from death. In keeping with tradition and the practice of the Church, we, too, pray for the faithful departed in every Eucharistic celebration.

Many of us live and proclaim our Christian faith and place all our hopes on the victory of Christ over sin and death. We are also aware of our shortcomings and failures and many are called into eternal life when least expected. The Church, in the Liturgy, prays for all who have died, both for those prepared and unprepared. It is our Christian faith and conviction that our prayers, sacrifices and especially the Mass/Eucharist, will help remit the sins, the unpreparedness, of those who have died.

Our practice of praying for the dead reminds us of our mortality and the immortal dimensions of our lives. It also reminds us that in our journey through life we are not always perfect. We need God, we need to pray:

> "By your power you bring us to birth, by your Providence you rule our lives. By your command you free us at last from sin as we return to the dust from which we came. Through the saving death of your Son we rise at your word to the glory of the resurrection."

We will also be celebrating the Solemnity of Christ the King that concludes the Church's Year of Worship. We will again renew our belief in the Real Presence of the Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament at the 6pm Mass.

The last Sunday of the month is the first Sunday of Advent and the liturgy begins a new cycle. We will be celebrating the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. This change will give us an opportunity to take a fresh look at the liturgical practice of the Church and to renew the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, which is the "source and summit" of Christian life. The faithful, encountering the Liturgy anew in the new text, can deepen their sharing in Christ's sacrifice, offering their lives to the Father as they worship "in Spirit and truth".


