Dear Malia Parishioners and Friends,

I just returned from my one week check-up after the chemo. The report was remarkable. My blood work is normal and the swollen lymph nodes have decreased by 75%. While the doctor was pleasantly amazed, he stated that such a dramatic turn after just one chemo series, while rare, is not unheard-of. I am still very tired but the doctor stated that this is more-than-likely due to the great work the chemo has been doing in my body.

I will see the doctor again next Monday, Oct 31. If I am still tired he may put off the chemo series set for Nov. 14 and 15 for a week or two. The good news is that if the chemo continues to bear such positive results, I may only need two or three series of chemo----not the six originally prescribed.

This, of course, is not a leukemia cure. It is pushing the leukemia into remission. But, I'll take remission!! Your love, prayers, and support have worked with the genius of modern medicine. To you, I am extremely grateful and hold you in the palm of my hands to the Lord.



Scripture Readings

Roman Missal - Third Edition

General Parish Catechesis V - Communion Rite & Concluding Rites - Nov. 2011

- In just a few weeks we will begin using the new English translation of the Roman Missal Third Edition.
- Let's consider a few more changes that appear in the Communion Rite and the Concluding Rites.
- At the Invitation to Communion, the priest will say: *Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.* This beautiful sentence is a fusion of the words of John the Baptist from John 1:29 and those found in the Book of Revelation 19:9. The word "behold" is a poetic word that invited us to a deeper contemplation of the mystery we are about to receive in the Sacrament.
- The people will respond: Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.
- The first half of the sentence echoes the words of the Gentile centurion when Jesus says he will visit his house to heal his servant who is ill (Mt 8:8 and Lk 7:6). Jesus is moved by his centurion's strong faith. In saying these words we too acknowledge both our unworthiness to receive such a gift as the Lord's body and blood and our faith that Jesus, nevertheless, comes to us in the Sacrament.
- "And my soul shall be healed," reminds us that the healing we receive in the Eucharist is a spiritual healing.
- Finally, in the Concluding Rite, Pope Benedict XVI put his own touch on the revised translation by adding two new options for the Dismissal. One is *"Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord."* The other is *"Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."* Having celebrated the Eucharist, these words now sum up, in a beautiful way, our mission as Christ's people in the world.
- Last summer, when the Holy Father gave his recognitio to the new translation, he encouraged us to implement it with patience and great charity. For priests who preside at the liturgy it means relearning almost all of the prayers of the Mass so we need to be especially understanding toward our priests. It will take some time for all of us to get used to the new words, but in time they will become a part of us.
- Remember the new translation is not just about changes to words. It's meant to change hearts and lead us to a deeper experience of Christ present in the liturgy.


