Pastor's Corner

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

Let us begin the Ordinary Time by calling to mind the words of St. Paul, "I do everything for the Gospel" (1 cor 9: 23). He also wrote to the Christians of Rome whom he intended to visit. In his letter, he said, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel; it is the power of *God* for salvation to everyone who has faith" (Rom 1: 16) .

The Church has often been referred to as the 'religion of the book'. Rightly so. But the Church is also more than that for our faith is grounded on the incarnate and living Word, Jesus Christ. So that being a disciple means that we have personally encountered Jesus and have come to a decision to follow him.

God's word, Jesus Christ, becomes for us the norm of our existence. In him "we live, we move and have our being."

We celebrate God's presence among us in the Sacred Liturgy. This is the setting in which *God* speaks to us. Christ himself becomes present in his Word since it is he who speaks when the Scriptures are proclaimed in the Liturgy. And it reaches its completion in the Eucharist. Jesus brings to fulfillment the ancient image which John in his Gospel speaks of, "The bread of *God* is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."

The relationship of Jesus, as God's incarnate Word, and the Church as the community of disciples, is a living and ongoing as each member is personally called to listen and allow God's Word to transform our lives.

May we, as a community of disciples, become the home of God's Word.
