# Ash Wednesday Schedule:

Wednesday, February 22 is Ash Wednesday. Our Mass schedule will be as follows: 6:00 am 12:15 am 7:00 pm Ashes will be distributed at all Masses.



The distribution of ashes reminds us of our own mortality and calls us to repentance. In the early Church, Ash Wednesday was the day on which

those who had sinned, and who wished to be readmitted to the Church, would begin their public penance. The ashes that we receive are a reminder of our own sinfulness, and many Catholics leave them on their foreheads all day as a sign of humility.

### Fasting and Abstinence Are Required:

The Church emphasizes the penitential nature of Ash Wednesday by calling us to <u>fast</u> and <u>abstain</u> from meat. Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 59 are required to fast, which means that they can eat only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat, or any food made with meat, on Ash Wednesday.

The following fasting and Ps 51:3-6a, 18-19 abstinence regulations are observed: Mt 9:14-15 • Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years of age and older. Saturday, Feb. 25 Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catho-• Is 58:9b-14 lics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age. Those Ps 86:1-6 bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals Lk 5:27-32 are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Sunday, Feb. 26 The special Paschal fast and abstinence are observed on Good Friday • Gn 9:8-15 and, where possible, on Holy Saturday. On these days, Christians Ps 25:4-9 prepare themselves by these disciplines in anticipation of the renewal 1 Pt 3:18-22 of their baptismal commitment on Easter. Mk 1:12-15 From its earliest days, the Church has urged the baptized and the catechumens to observe the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer as a preparation for the celebration of Easter.
