Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus!

One of the characteristics of Jesus is that he loved to eat. He loved to break bread together with others. In today's Gospel of the multiplication of the loaves, Jesus took bread and distributed it to the people who were hungry and had been following him. He is not just the Good Shepherd gathering the lost sheep. He is also the Bread that gives life.

The early Christians were also known as a community who breaks bread. They celebrated the central mystery of the faith in the bread, broken, blessed and shared in the Eucharistic meal. This shows us that true Christian spirituality is expressed in our willingness to become broken to bring life to others. It is to love just as Jesus loved us. God gave us a body to enflesh his love. This can only happen to the extent that we too are willing to be broken and shared for others.
