`Ahahui Hale O Nā Ali`i O Hawai`I

Each year, on January 1st, the `Ahahui Hale O Na Ali`i O Hawai`i, celebrates the Anniversary of the birth of HRH Princess Abigail Wahiikaahuula Campbell Ka-wananakoa on O`ahu, while sister chapters honor her at their respective churches.

The Hilo Lodge, Halau O Kala-kaua, would

like to extend its sincere MAHALO A NUI LOA to St. Joseph's Church for allowing us to celebrate her anniversary on this island of Hawai`i at the 9:00 am Sunday mass on January 4, 2014.

The Princess' mother church from birth through her passing on April 12, 1945 was Our Lady of Peace Cathedral in downtown Honolulu.

The `Ahahui Hale O Nā Ali`i O Hawai`i is a benevolent organization where men and women are Hawaiian. The organization was founded by the Princess Abigail Wahīika`ahu`ula Kawānanakoa in 1918. Princess Kawānanakoa was the daughter of James Campbell and HRH Abigail Kaihelani Mai-pinepine of Lahaina, Maui. She married Prince David Kahalepouli Kawānanakoa Pi`ikoi.

Princess Kawānanakoa's profound desire was to:

- reach out through the islands and organize a unique society of Hawaiian men and women
- to unite and uphold the morale of her people
- to gain deeper respect for each other.

There are seven [7] lodges in the State Benevolent Society governed by a State Board of Governors of the `Ahahui Hale O Na Ali`i O Hawai`i; on the Big Island we have a chapter in Hilo and Waimea; two chapters on O`ahu and a chapter on each of the islands of Maui, Kaua`i and Moloka`i.

1. Search Your Local Information Website for Upcoming Events

They always have fun, free events and activities for young families to take advantage of: plays, puppet shows, museum tickets, kid fitness events. There is always something. You just have to want to find it!

2. Sing Together

This is a great season to sing along to the radio or if any of your family members play instruments, invite them to especially those students who have music class or those preschool aged children who are learning all the classic holiday songs.

3. Attend a Sibling's Sporting Event

There is some sort of power in supporting others. It not only helps them feel appreciated but it also helps you appreciate the accomplishments and talents of others more. As you take the other kids to watch a sibling play sports or participate in an activity or play, it really builds comradery and brings the family together.

4. Watch a TV Series Together

5. Do a Service Project for a Neighbor or Close Friend

Find someone in the community that could use some help. Whether it be yard work, fixing up the house, or even just someone to come and keep them company, take the family and spend some time serving.

6. Go to the Movies

This seems a little overplayed but it can still be a good time. Especially if your family is not one to go out much, it can be a treat to take the whole family to the theater and watch a wholesome movie together. Talk about the movie after words, what each family member's favorite part was, worst part, who was the best actor, favorite character and why... etc.

7. Game Night

Board games and card games are a fan favorite for many families over many generations. Try different games that parents and grandparents remember. Also try to put a new angle on classic games like a real-live clue game with dress up and a mystery dinner. (Fan Favorites, Candyland, Jenga, Clue, Shoots and Ladders, Monopoly, Trumps, Operation, Etc.) Get the actural games and not the electronic ones....that is too easy to be alone.

8 Pick the Meal Wheel

Make a spin wheel with the names of each family member. Spin the wheel and whoever the pin lands on that's who gets to pick where you go for dinner that night AND what you eat (buckle your seat belt as you may be in for some exotic dishes). The next time you do it be sure to take the last person who won off the wheel to make sure everyone gets a chance.

9. Read Together

Find a good book that the family can enjoy. Pick a time each morning or evening when the family can get together for 15 minutes or so and site down to read together. You can talk about what you've ready during and after reading to get discussion from everyone.

10. Go For a Sunday Stroll

One of our favorite family quality times is just going for a walk on Sunday afternoon. The kids get their bikes, and we stroll around the neighborhood, the only rule is that we stay at a "family pace".
