<u>Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli</u>

Christ the King:

"Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom."

Today's Solemnity of the Christ the King, which is the fitting culmination of the liturgical year, was established by Pope Pius XI who through his encyclical, Quas Primas, in 1925. Pope Pius XI states the reason for so doing:

"... And We remember saying that these manifold evils in the world were due to the fact that the majority of men had thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law out of their lives; that these had no place either in private affairs or in politics: and We said further, that as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations."

But who among us would want to follow the kingship of Jesus, who hangs on the cross? He is an image of human weakness. Jesus on the cross was seemingly helpless and it seems that God has forsaken Him already. We probably would have also silently walked away like the others who were disappointed with Jesus show of human weakness. Are not kings supposed to be a picture of power and affluence? Well, one of the thieves who hang on the cross with Him did recognize Jesus as King. I guess it takes one who has embraced one's cross to see the truth of Jesus' kingship – that His is a Kingdom where true power lies in the capacity to make a gift of oneself if only others may have life. Are we ready to embrace the cross of Christ and make a gift of ourselves?


