

13th Sunday in Ordinary

Dear brothers and sisters, Peace!

The Priest's Convocation last May 9-13 focused on Intentional Discipleship. We have learned from the speaker that majority of even "active" American Catholics are still at an early, that is, passive stage of spiritual development. In other words, most of our parishioners are not yet "disciples". And so they will never be "apostles" (meaning, sent) until they have begun to seriously follow Jesus.

In our Gospel for this Sunday we find Jesus and the disciples on their way to Jerusalem in order to face his death. Now, who would want to go with Jesus knowing that he would be arrested, tried, and be put to death?

But here we see Jesus aflame with love for the Father and love for us. This love enabled his destiny even if that destiny is humanly unpleasant. Nothing, not even death, could prevent him from fulfilling the will of the Father. Jesus is free enough to answer the call of his mission.

Brothers and sisters, as I leave St. Joseph Church to continue my mission, it is my prayer that more parishioners and even non-parishioners may come to know Jesus, and to serve Jesus.

Yes, when we respond to the call of discipleship it is always with a price. But the reward is so great. The reward is Jesus himself and his promise of the Kingdom of God.

With these words, I would like to thank each one of you for the meaningful experience that I had for the past seven years as your Pastor. Because of you, I have grown in my discipleship.


