Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli

1st Sunday of Advent:

"...so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man."

"Advent" comes from the Latin word," *advenire*" which means "to come". But more than the dreaded coming hustles and bustles of holiday preparations and shopping, it is primarily all about the joyful expectation of coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

And the liturgy of the first three weeks of Advent speaks of the different comings of Christ in our life – his first coming at the cave in Bethlehem but equally of the second and final coming of Jesus at the end of time. But in between are those ordinary and most of the time unnoticed comings of Christ in our everyday life. But we can only prepare for these comings in an atmosphere of waiting and watching.

But in our world today waiting and watching are seen as unproductive. And in this time and age where we live in a society that is result-driven because results feed the economy then we become restless and unable to see the giftedness of the moments – the gift of Presence of Christ in our midst. We are urged to speed along ever and ever faster, and yet our souls cry out for silence and stillness.

Today's gospel insists on the necessity to be awake and prepared for His coming. No doubt he is referring to his coming at the end of time, as well as to his private coming for each one of us at the end of our lives. And the best way to prepare for these coming encounters with Christ is to be at home with his presence—that is to live in the present moments with all its God-given surprises and meeting Christ already in the here and now.

Perhaps Advent seems outmoded, even ancient and irrelevant for the 21st century. Yet, what is not outmoded, ancient, or irrelevant is that God comes, comes, ever comes. When we take the time to wait, we become aware of that presenceSomebody send Life is a perpetual Advent – a perpetual waiting for what is to come. But it is in this waiting we trust begins to grow especially trust in the God whose true joy is to have us spend an eternity with HIM.

All mass intentions for the souls of the faithful departed can be read on all Sunday masses except the designated time for *Misa Pro Populo*. We will accommodate those people who have no opportunity to offer mass for their love ones.

Lastly, I do pray that this Season of Advent is an opportunity for our renewal and commitment to God, as we prepare ourselves for the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Maranatha!*
