We have seen his star in the East and have come to adore Him.

What can we expect from the God of surprises if not precisely that – a surprise! This is what unfolds for us in this Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord or what we traditionally called the Feast of the Three Kings. The surprise from the gospel is there is never a mention of these visitors from the East, that they were kings or that there are three of them. But this what we know for sure – these wise men from the east were seeking the Lord because they saw the star which revealed his coming. It was not because of their own wisdom that they came, it was because God surprised them with a Star! Now they come with one purpose: To adore Him. And they did so by presenting him with their gifts.

Using a star or any ordinary event to speak to man simply shows God's abundant grace when He seeks us sinners though we are. He would be ready to stoop to our level and meet us there. He shines His light on us in ways that we can understand and respond to.

But hopefully like the Magi, when we encounter Jesus, at any point in our journey, we are moved to respond by offering him a gift – our gift of adoration. They need not be gold, frankincense or myrrh. They can very well be the resources and talents that we have to be put in the service of the poor and those in need. They can be the time that we have to spend for those who need a listening ear or companionship. They can be our offer of forgiveness for those who are longing for peace of heart or mind.

And after the wise offered their gifts, "they departed for their own country". They quietly returned home and went on with their lives and nothing more was spoken about them. But we can be sure that they were different men, men who by faith had seen the Lord and worshiped Him.

That's what the Lord would have us do this Christmas and the whole of our lives: respond to His initiative in sending His Son by seeking Jesus as our King. Having found Him and worshiped Him return to our homes, and travel thru life by a different route as the Magi did. We will not be afraid to put away the worldly attitudes and attachments which we might have held dear and instead take on those values of Christ and be his witness in our world today.

Having followed that star once in our life we just might became a light, like the star, that will guide people in their own search for Christ in order to adore Him.





St. Joseph School will be increasing tuition rates for the Elementary School and Junior/ Senior High School next school year 2017-2018 to help compensate our teachers with reasonable and competitive salaries. The increase is still signifi-

cantly less than both our private school counterparts on Hawaii Island as well as other Catholic schools in the State. Tuition will also include a comprehensive fee which will cover things like books, student fees (i.e year-book, etc.), and some activity fees excluding field trips/excursions and special class projects. (Country Fair ticket obligations will remain a separate fee and part of the enrollment contract.) The School Board recently submitted the tuition proposal for Parish review and approval. We will announce the new figures in January once they are approved by the Pastor and the Parish Finance Council. A sibling discount is also part of the new tuition schedule. We are excited about these changes, but we wanted to ensure that these initiatives would not be a significant burden on our families.

Financial Aid will be available to all qualifying families.
