Weekly Reflection: 4th Sunday of Ordinary" Time - Cycle B
"He taught them as one having authority"

Do you like people telling you what to do? As free and intelligent individuals, we think we know ourselves best and most of the time know what we must do. That is why we tend to challenge, directly or indirectly, those who claim authority over us. And because of abuses and failures, there is a great breakdown in society's acceptance of authority. The trust we place in those with authority seems to have crumbled.

Today's gospel offers us a chance to revisit our understanding of authority. Unlike the scribes, he taught as one having authority. At his word that unclean spirits are cast out. But more than the back-up of such miracle Christ is trustworthy as an authority mainly for three reasons: he knows the truth, hares it selflessly and witnesses to it with His life. At the beginning of His ministry during His baptism, we are told How the Father affirms Jesus' identity: "You are my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." With this certainty, He came bringing only the One True Good News of God's Love for us. And He went about proclaiming this truth of God's love to every person he encounters through His preaching and through His miracles. But most of all His whole life is an embodiment of this unconditional Love of God for us when He willingly embraced the cross for our salvation.

Due to his perfect knowledge and perfect love, we know that where he leads us is truly the best path for us. And so, must anybody who claims any authority over another person, they, too must embody this knowledge of Divine Truth and Authentic Love. We might not be able to perform great miracles like Jesus did, but the greatest proof of our authority is the witness of our lives!

From Palm Sunday to Ash Wednesday

Through the liturgical year, we journey from Christ's birth to his ministry and on through his Passion, death, and Resurrection. As part of that journey to Easter, we celebrate Palm Sunday during which we receive palm branches that are blessed just before we hear the Gospel reading of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. We then take the palms home to be kept in a safe place until next year. Many mainland parishes must order their fresh palms from supply companies. At St. Joseph we have always been fortunate that our parishioners are able to donate enough palms so that each family can take home at least one or two. Others donate their time to clean the palms before the Palm Sunday celebrations.

Those blessed palms are traditionally returned to the church in the following year to be burned and ground into the ashes used to mark our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. This year it falls on February 14. There is no specific rite that accompanies the burning of the palm branches; the ashes themselves will be blessed during the Ash Wednesday liturgy. Any ashes that remain after the liturgy are disposed of in the sacrarium, the sink in the sacristy which drains directly into the ground. The ashes symbolize not only our repentance but also our eventual death. As Christ showed us, only by dying may we—through Him—come to eternal life.

We invite you to participate more fully in Ash Wednesday by returning your blessed, dried palms by Sunday, February 11. Bins will be available at the church entrances.


