Weekly Reflection: 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year B – July 15, 2018

Sent to proclaim the Kingdom of God

After more than two thousand years since Jesus preached this gospel, we might question the soundness of these instructions of the Lord: to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. “How then can they effectively preached the Gospels?”, we ask. The Lord is just speaking figuratively but is He? Or are we just watering down the message of the Lord because we are afraid to embrace it? And thus, the seed of the kingdom of God is having a difficulty taking roots in the lives of the faithful.

For indeed, behind the radical counsel of the Lord is a sense of urgency and single mindedness in fulfilling the mission entrusted to his disciples. The proclamation of the coming of Kingdom of God becomes our only priority and everything else takes second place. And yes, this would entail a life of true sacrifice which St. Ignatius of Loyola described us a life of true generosity exemplified by his prayer: *“to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest,”*

As disciples of the Lord today, we are called to embrace the mission of proclaiming the Kingdom of God. We are called to be the person of Christ to our world today. And this means everything that we are and everything we possess must be put at the service of God’s kingdom. Are we ready to be sent to proclaim the Kingdom of God? If we do then trust, God will provide.

**Testify as a Witness to
Jesus: Healing Mass**

I went to the Healing Mass wanting to heal a pain in my abdomen that I had for several months. I was somewhat anxious as I had surgery for colon cancer 9 years ago. I asked the doctor about it a couple of times, and after some tests, the doctor didn't find the cause of the pain. At the Healing Mass I was asked to assist people down after

they were anointed and prayed over by Father. Fr. Wil asked for everyone to pray as he prayed over each person, which I did. As I was praying for someone with my arm stretched out to the person, I felt a warmth come over me and a voice telling me, "You are healed." I felt at peace and was surprised, as I was praying for someone else and not for me, and Fr. Wil was not praying over me at that time. The pain in my abdomen disappeared and has not returned. Praise God! Amen.....(God is awesome, all the time!) *-Anonymous*

I have been attending the monthly Healing Masses, as it is such a special grace to be personally anointed & prayed over by the Priest. In early February I had a routine surgery done and they monitored my heart during the surgery. The nurses were very concerned, because it showed that I had *atrial fibrillation*. I was referred to my primary care doctor, who did an EKG & found the same results. He referred me to the cardiologist. After meeting with the cardiologist, he referred me to take a stress-echo test before deciding on a course of treatment. By the time I took the actual test, I had attended 3 healing masses (Feb., March, and April). When I took the test, I had a different cardiologist attending. He was absolutely flabbergasted. He questioned the nurses whether he had the correct EKG, & joked that maybe they should fingerprint me to verify I really belonged to that EKG..... because the test showed *no atrial fibrillation*, but instead a perfectly healthy heart with no blockages or irregularities! He was puzzled! ...asked me what medications I was on, but I answered that I am taking no meds. I attribute this healing to the power of God, manifested through the prayers offered for me during the Healing Masses. I didn't even ask for this healing, because I didn't think it was healable! God touches us in ways He knows we need to be healed....all praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ & Your Holy Spirit! *-J.T.*
