



This is the last time I will be writing in the Pastor's Corner as your Pastor. My presence and work here in the community for the past 2 ½ years have been personally fruitful and rewarding. When I took over as your Pastor, I promised to bring all I am capable of, to the table. I promised not to spare myself. I can honestly say that I have done that. It would not have been possible without the cooperation of so many of you.

The parish bulletin is the face of the parish and I set out to improve the quality of the bulletin. You have now undoubtedly one of the best parish bulletins in the country. We have now a well-trained parish bulletin committee with great talent and they can continue the work.

The clustered parishes of St. Joseph and Malia Puka O Kalani, at times had a differential relationship. To bring the community together I changed the name to Hilo Roman Catholic Community with a unified single Pastoral Council. When I realized the desire of the parishioners of Malia to be independent and de-clustered, I worked towards it. We got the rectory of Malia repaired and habitable and we were fortunate to have Fr. Joe Hennen to come and live and work from there. He did a lot to bring the community back together and it is a blessing that he is coming back in September to take care of Malia. They have almost everything in place to be an independent parish. Maybe another 30 or so families joining the parish could seal the deal. Through the hard work of the joined pastoral council led by Linda and John Tolmie, we were able to come up with a mission statement for the Hilo Roman Catholic Community.

The life of any Catholic community is centered on the Eucharist. We concentrated on it and took great pains to train the Eucharistic Ministers, Sacristans, Altar servers, Lectors, etc. The Catholic Church is blessed with a beautiful liturgy which is the result of 2000 years of development and improvement. I personally went to great lengths to make the liturgy prayerful, reverent, uplifting and solemn. Too much of casualness about the liturgy can take away the sense of the sacred. Sr. Marykutty, as the Pastoral Assistant, is always there to make our liturgy enriching.

Any parish community should have not only a place to worship but also a place to gather to celebrate the important events of life like baptism, wedding, funeral etc. The purpose of a parish hall is to build the community and bring the members of the parish together. St. Joe lacks that and that is the reason I turned my attention to that. George Madden and the Parish Hall team did a lot to push the project. It has faced some set backs of late. But it is my hope under the new Pastoral leadership you will pick it up and bring it to completion at an early date.

The neglected maintenance of the Rectory was a concern and we did turn our attention to that. The creaky corridors have been reclaimed and made beautiful and where needed we have done painting work and also laying the carpets. We upgraded a suite for the Bishop and other distinguished guests. The leaky roof of the rectory was a concern and our maintenance team has everything in place to start work on it. It will be accomplished in the next month or so.

One of the priorities of the diocese and the parish has been the faith formation of our young people. We have a full time youth and young adult coordinator and we have a youth choir now. It is a pleasure to see these young people dedicating their time and talent to Jesus and the community. Over 170 kids attend the RE program and Sr. Lusika along with the other three sisters run the program. Joyce Saenz set the tone. It is going to be heart-warming to see the sisters along with the other lay RE teachers taking care of our young kids. Carol Dennis and her helpers run a magnificent RCIA program.

For any parish, taking care of the poor is an essential activity. We now have Sr. Ruth Zonunthari, a well-qualified (MSW) coordinator who runs the food pantry at St. Joe and Malia. She is involved in the inter-faith program, counseling, and also working in collaboration with OSM and Catholic Charities. She and her committee of volunteers are getting ready to launch a Bereavement Ministry for the community.

June 28, 2009: Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

Readings: Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24; 2 Cor 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mk 5:21-43

First Reading: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24

The Book of Wisdom is one of the deutero-canonical (= second list) or apocryphal (= hidden) books. It was never in the Hebrew canon (list) of Scriptures, and is omitted from most Protestant versions of the Bible (or put in an appendix). The point of this passage is that death cannot be part of God's plan because God does not act only to see his work end in corruption. Death therefore comes through human sin. Those who bind themselves to evil strangle God's gift of life in them.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11, 12, 13

Psalm 30 is a thanksgiving song of a person who has recovered from a serious illness. There are contrasting emotions of sadness giving rise to pleading, and the overwhelming joy spontaneously bringing forth praise. Response: "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15

Paul in this passage encourages the Corinthians to be generous in a collection for the impoverished Jerusalem Church. The motivation he gives is twofold: 1) imitation of the generosity of Christ and 2) a demonstration of equality between Greek and Jewish Christians. Sharing of possessions between these two Christian communities is not only a concrete gesture of receiving the other as an equal, but also an expression of the communion that exists between them.

Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

This Gospel reading presents two models of faith — both imperfect but open to growth. Jairus, the synagogue official and the woman come to Jesus as a last resort. Their hearts are not centered on God but on their own need. They approach Jesus to get something from him rather than to become his disciples. Jesus does not condemn or scorn their self-centered and superstitious attitude that sees him as wonder-worker and healer rather than as revealer of divine love and compassion. Instead, Jesus responds to their overwhelming sense of need as they present it to him, thereby removing this obstacle to their growth in faith. In both instances, Jesus explicitly turns their sense of need into faith, and both miracles free those affected not only from the bonds of evil, but also into fullness of life.



Please welcome Sister Lisa Chettri, MSMHC, as vice-principal of the elementary division. You may have seen Sister Lisa at Mass at St. Joseph Parish. Sister comes from Darjeeling, West Bengal, India and has served as principal of a school of one thousand students. Sister Lisa has already met many of you informally, has taken part in the last ES faculty meeting of the year and has been working in the ES office in Colette's absence. Fr. Tom

Sr. Lisa Chettri, a former High School principal is now the Vice-principal of the Elementary School, and Sr. Leena Piholi will also teach in the school. Their presence in the school will assure a continuity of sisters working in the school especially because the Sisters of St. Francis are leaving Hilo. These five sisters are my gift to you. Love them and take care of them. They will enrich the life of the parish and school.
