Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace!

This is the greeting of the Risen Lord to the disciples. It is also His gift to them. Then He showed his wounded hands and side to remind them that the One who had been crucified is the same One who is truly risen.

This brings home a very important message that the risen life does not eliminate the wounds of the past. It rather transforms the wounds.

Today, we are made to realize that the wounds of Christ are not just reminders of his brutal death on the Cross. The wounds of Christ are also the wounds of love for which mercy and peace flowed. From the open wounds of Christ came love and mercy. On the other hand, the wounds are a reminder of our own wickedness. We have inflicted the wounds of Christ because we persist in our sinfulness.

As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, let us be reminded that the world needs mercy; we need mercy. But even if the world is wounded; even if we are



wounded, let us allow
our wounds to become
signs of God's mercy
because from our
wounds might flow heal-
ing for others.

Sunday Reflection

Second Sunday of Easter (C) April 11, 2010

Acts 5:12-16, Ps 118:2-4, 13-15,
22-24, Rv 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19,
Jn 20:19-31

"I'll need to see some proof"—how often have you used that expression?

Most of us are quick to call for proof for anything out of the ordinary. We don't want to be "taken in" by extravagant claims or scams.

So today's Gospel, the story of "Doubting Thomas," has a modern appeal. It sounds natural to us for Thomas to want to have his doubts answered with real proof. But Jesus praises those who believe *without* any physical proof. He calls such believers "blessed."

This Easter story is specifically directed at us, those who would come to believe in Jesus down through the ages. We welcome the testimony of those who went before us: those who walked with Jesus after his resurrection and went on to witness to him throughout the world. We are part of a community of faith, a living legacy passed on from generation to generation and often given at great cost, with personal sacrifice. When we hear this Gospel proclaimed in a community of believers this Easter, we can take heart in the Lord's words. And where my faith wavers, I can gain strength from the Holy Spirit at work in the midst of the community of faith.

Holy Week and Easter Liturgical Celebrations like we had at Malia don't just happen. They are the result of a lot of planning, generosity, practicing, and hard work. The entire parish and our many guests were able to better participate and celebrate the Paschal Mysteries because there was such great participation on the part of so many. We give our special MAHALO to: The Liturgy Committee, the Choir, the Liturgical Ministers, those that decorated the church and the hall (what a transformation that was!!), those who sewed, those who donated flowers and plants, and those who arranged the flowers, those who printed and assembled the programs, those who cleaned up and arranged for the next service, those who cooked (that soup was five star!), and those who served, and, most especially all who joined in the liturgical celebrations. The entire Holy Week was a service of love and a witness to the deep faith and pride of our parish ohana.

TERMITE TREATMENT:

All the buildings will receive the tented termite treatment this week. The church and rectory and the patio area will be tented (and hence, unusable) on Thursday and Friday, April 15 and 16. The hall and the school will be tented and treated on Saturday and Sunday April 17 and 18. The "wiping down" will start at 11:00 am.

THE SWEET BREADS AND THE ROOF:



The Sweet Bread Project headed by Shirley, May-Belle, and JoAnne brought a total profit to the parish of \$2,282.00! 700 tickets were sold. We are very grateful to these three women and to all who embraced this fund raising project. They have decided to make this an annual Lenten Fund-Raising Project for Malia. This year, the total profit went to the Re-Roofing of the church.

Regarding the Re-Roofing Project, we exceeded our goal by about \$1,500.00. The excess (is there ever an excess?) will go to the re-roofing of the old garage (the roof over the walk-in refrigerator). This roof has been condemned and must be replaced. The Maintenance Committee recommended and the Finance Committee approved a bid by the same company that is replacing the church roof. Both roofs will be done simultaneously. There are a few pledge commitments which need to be paid. Feel free to take your time in making the payments. If you over pledged and are not able to make the payment, contact Fr. Joe to let him know.

DRAFT OF PARISH MISSION STATEMENT:

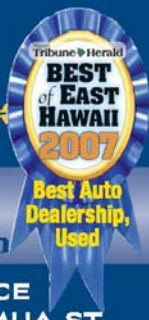
