Dear brothers and sisters,
Peace!

The feast day of Saint Peter Julian Eymard, the Apostle of the Eucharist and Founder of the Blessed Sacrament Fathers, Brothers and Sisters, falls on August 2, (Monday). The late Pope John Paul II said, "St. Peter Julian Eymard: This man of fire was possessed by Christ's love as revealed to us in his Eucharist; he ardently desired to manifest it to his contemporaries. Along with his companions, he inaugurated a form of religious life in which the Eucharist is the heart. His life, nourished by the Eucharist which he celebrated and contemplated, was enriched with ministries of all kinds. Under the influence of the Holy Spirit, he saw 'how much a force of renewal the Eucharist constitutes for the Church and society.'"

Saint Peter Julian Eymard could very well be our model of how it is to give of ourselves (Gift of Self) to God and our fellow human beings. He said, "The greatest grace in my life has been a lively faith in the Holy Eucharist." (Retreat Notes, April 28, 1868).

In our Gospel, Jesus warns that the greedy has no place in the Kingdom. A greedy person (as oppose to the person who gives of him/herself to God and to others) is a fool who thinks that by amassing riches, he/she can grow rich in the sight of God.

Let us ask for the intercession of St. Peter Julian Eymard that we may be generous in giving of ourselves to God and others.

Reflection

August 1, 2010 | 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Eccl 1:2; 2:21-23 ; Ps 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17 ; Col 3:1-5, 9-11, Lk 12:13-21

A favorite contemporary singer-songwriter of mine is Greg Brown. His blues and folk tunes tell down-to-earth stories. In one of his songs, entitled "The Cheapest Kind," Brown sings a first-person account of a man who grew up as the son of a preacher. The family was poor, and they traveled about the country preaching the Good News. Their poverty led the parents to reluctantly settle for always buying the "cheapest kind" of food or clothing. But Brown sings that the love in that family wasn't cheap: It was, rather, what made them truly rich.

His song comes to mind as I reflect on today's Gospel. Jesus invites us to ponder what are the true riches in human life. In the story Jesus tells, the man whose barn is bursting with an abundant harvest, plans on building *bigger* barns. He believes he's totally self-sufficient with all that stored-up wealth.

Jesus teaches that those who rely solely on material goods, and allow them to control their existence to the point of greed and possessiveness are storing up treasures that will not last. It's being "rich in what matters to God" that is true wealth in the Kingdom. Examine your heart this Sunday. Have you focused on material goods, treasures that will not last? Or have you allowed God to fill you with love—with wealth of the "richest kind?"

PETER JULIAN EYMARD: THE APOSTLE OF THE ECHARIST

Peter Julian Eymard's (1811-1868) search for God was conditioned by the familial, social and religious context of his day as well as the graces he received from God. His religious consciousness was molded at an early age. He pursued his desire to be a priest despite the opposition of his father, and his being the only son to carry on the family name and business.

After a long struggle because of poor health Peter Julian eventually became a priest. He devoted himself to his ministry. Though strict with himself, he always seemed to radiate kindness and gentleness with the people he served. He had an extensive ministry to preaching missions and retreats. He also exhibited a resolute apostolic commitment to the rag-pickers in the slums of Paris.

The Eucharist, God's manifest gift of love, was the focus of all the energies of his life. In time, he learned to subordinate everything to this love of his life. His heart, soul and mind were shaped gradually by this sacrament.

As the Eucharist became the dominant force of his existence, he also maintained a strong devotion to the Church and to the Mission. He had been preoccupied by the lack of spiritual assistance for diocesan priests, the lack of spiritual direction for lay people, a general lack of devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, and the frequent offenses committed against this sacrament.

The keystone of Peter Julian's spirituality and charism was what he called "the gift of self". Just as God gave us everything in giving us his Son, and Jesus gave himself completely on the Cross and in the Eucharist, so should our Christian lives be a total gift of self to Christ.

Peter Julian's entire life was a faith journey. He courageously moved from one state of life to another, often at anguished personal cost but always in search of the will of God for him. For him the cost of discipleship was high indeed; in fact it cost him his life. Death overtook him before he had completed his task as founder of a religious men and women dedicated to the Eucharist. He had launched his divine project yet it was left to others to complete it. His mission: to proclaim the riches of the Paschal Mystery for the life of the world.

Just as his was a life modeled and motivated by a deep sense of the transforming power of the Paschal Mystery, so should our faith journey be stamped by the Eucharist, "source and summit of the life of the Church." May Saint Peter Julian Eymard inspire us to deepen our appreciation of the Eucharistic Mystery, and obtain for us the grace of fidelity to our mission in the Church and society.






ADULT SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION:


