

Pastor's Corner

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

Christmas is about God "gift-ing" us with his Son Jesus Christ. As we get closer to the birth of the Son of God let us contemplate on three gifts that we could ask the Lord to bestow on us: the gift of faith, the gift of doing God's will, and the gift of joy and rejoicing.

The gift of faith is inspired by Elizabeth's words to Mary: "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Elizabeth praises Mary for accepting the invitation to be the Mother of God; for believing that, despite not knowing what is in store for her, she would be in God's protection. Let us ask God for the gift of faith that Mary has.

The gift of doing God's will is inspired by the letter to the Hebrews. When Christ comes into the world, he speaks the words of the psalmist: "Sacrifice and offering you do not want; but ears open to obedience you gave me. Holocausts and sin offerings you do not require; so I said, 'Here I am; your commands for me are written in the scroll. To do your will is my delight; my God, your law is in my heart" (Ps 40: 7-9).

Jesus follows the will of the Father who sent him into the world. In the end, when he is asked to pay the price for being just, for staying in the truth, for serving the needy and the poor, for insisting on the primacy of love, he accepts death, death on the cross. The same holds true for us. We need to follow Jesus who said, "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me." Let us ask God for the gift of doing his will.

The gift of rejoicing is inspired by Elizabeth. When Mary comes to visit her, she exclaims: "For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy." Let us indeed spend some time to be connected to the very source of our joy, that is Jesus Christ. Let us ask God for the gift genuine rejoicing.

On this last Sunday of Advent, we beg the Child to be born in the manger to bestow on us these three gifts: the gift of faith like that of Mary; the gift of doing God's will, like that of Jesus Christ; the gift of joy and rejoicing, like that of Elizabeth.

News from St. Joseph School

LEARNERS TODAY, LEADERS TOMORROW

As part of the STEM program, which promotes learning through hands on experiences and problem solving in real life situations, St. Joseph School arranged a two day field trip, on November 19 and 20, to the island of Oahu for the eighth grade class. The purpose of the trip was to give students the advantage they deserve and the opportunity to broaden their horizons.

On Day One, students visited Challenger Center of Hawaii, which featured a realistic Mission Control, modeled after NASA's Johnson Space Center, where the students were assigned actual jobs that astronauts perform, both in mission control and on space shuttles.

Later that day, students went to Bishop Museum. Docents immersed them in the Museum's most sacred and beloved artifacts, culminating with a private showing in the planetarium.

Day Two began at Pearl Harbor, with a boat trip to the USS Arizona Memorial. The afternoon was spent at the Waikiki Aquarium; students were divided into skill building teams, taking notes and learning about various fish and sea creatures.

COLLEGE TOUR OF THE WEST COAST

St. Joseph Jr/Sr High School just concluded their first ever College Tour of the West Coast. On November 19-28, ten Big Island students started the nine day road trip in Seattle, Washington and finished in San Diego,



California. Among the colleges toured were Washington University, Portland University, Oregon State, University of San Francisco, Stanford, Santa Clara University, University of California Irvine, and University of San Diego.

"A trip like this is a great way for Big Island students to see what Mainland universities have to offer." said Dr. Nathan Yocum, the trip organizer. "It's important that our students know how accessible higher education is."

"It gave me a great insight to what kind of college I will go to," said Kapua Jacunski, one of the students.

"This was a once in a lifetime experience that I'll never forget," said Malia Nemeth, another of the students.


