Pastor's Corner

First Sunday of Lent, February, 21, 2010.

Dear Parishioners,

Lent is very much different from Christmas. During Christmas we remember the Son of God coming to us in the form of a helpless baby. We are joyful, for the birth of this child that initiated the process of our salvation.

This child grew up and continued the process of salvation by allowing himself to be baptized by John in the river Jordan. In this event, Jesus was revealed as God's beloved Son. And as Son his mission is to be Messiah.

In the First Sunday of Lent we see Jesus being tempted in the wilderness: to turn the stone into bread, to acquire power for himself, and to gain fame for his sake. Jesus will again reveal himself as God's beloved Son by overcoming these temptations and centering himself to the Father. Now he is ready to do his mission as Messiah.

Lent is a time for us to realize that our temptations are those acts of taking possession of ourselves as if we are our own god. This is the time for us to unfreeze this make-believe illusion. There is only One God who happens to not be you.

Let us make Lent an 'acceptable time the day of our salvation,' a season when all of us '... must be more earnest in prayer and fasting, in almsgiving and in watching.' (St. Ambrose of Milan).

Sunday Reflection:

First Sunday of Lent (C)

February 21, 2010

Dt 26:4-10 Ps 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15 Rm 10:8-13 Lk 4:1-13

Knowing your roots—it's become an obsession for many of us.

There's a wealth of resources available for researching one's family history; people enjoy knowing about their ancestors and where they came from. When we learn about our family's past we can appreciate the cultural riches our ancestors brought to us, their descendants.

In today's first reading, Moses makes knowing the family history a part of the worship of Israel—and so it is to this day. As part of every Seder service, Jewish families retell the story of the Exodus from Egypt. We Catholics also bring our "family history" into our liturgy. Our Lenten season chooses some of the most basic stories of faith to remind us where we've come from. More importantly, these stories lead us directly to Jesus, and the story of our redemption in his death and resurrection. Today, as we hear of the Lord's temptations in the desert, let's let this very human portrait of Jesus remind us of how we're called to respond in times of temptation: To depend upon God's grace, and allow it to support and sustain us. It's the living story of our faith, our Baptismal commitment, which we reaffirm in this Lenten season.

2010 Lenten Regulations

ABSTINENCE:

- All persons who have completed their 14th year are bound by the law of abstinence from meat.
- Complete abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday during the Triduum.
- The faithful will not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. On days of complete abstinence, meat and soup or gravy made from meat are not to be eaten.

FAST:

- All adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60th year. According to Canon 97, #1, a person who has completed the 18th year is an adult.
- The day of fast during Lent is Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17) the day of fast during the Triduum is Good Friday (April 2).
- The faithful will not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation..

Dear Families and Friends of St. Joseph School,

On behalf of the Saint Joseph School students, faculty and staff, and community, we extend our heartfelt thanks to those of you who donated to the Augustine Fund for tuition assistance in the 2010-2011 school year. Speaking of making a difference, I would like to pass on our 2009 standardized test scores. In grades 2 through 8, our classes averaged 77 percentile where 50 percentile was the national norm. In our ACT college readiness test, SJS high school students achieved a 69% composite average - significantly above the average benchmark composite score of 22 %. Though faith formation remains our primary purpose of existence at Saint Joseph School, we continue to pledge our commitment to high academic standards, a disciplined approach, and moral character development.

I hope to see you at our next Open House on Tuesday, March 23, from 8:30 am to 11 am. At any time, you may also stop in to pick up an enrollment application and a tuition assistance form.

SOCIALIZING:

BAPTISMS AT MALIA:

There are no Baptisms during Lent. However, we will have a Baptismal Preparation Class for parents who will want their children Baptized in April, May, or June. We are tentatively looking at Saturday, March 20, 12:30 – 2:00. The classes will be conducted by Fr. Joe. It is required that parents participate in a Baptismal Preparation Course prior to the Baptism of the child. The Godparents are encouraged to participate but it is not required. Any parishioner who

would like a refresher course on basic Catholicism is welcome to attend. At least one of the Godparents (preferably both) must be a practicing Catholic. At Malia we will have Baptisms no more than once a month during the 5:15 Saturday Mass and once a month during the 9:00 Sunday Mass. Parents can also opt for a private Baptism with no Mass at a time mutually agreeable to them and Fr. Joe. We will soon announce the name of a person and the contact information who will be the Baptism Coordinator for Malia.

FIRST COMMUNION

The Religious Education/Formation Committee stated that although the regular religious education program is preferable, they recommended that the parish offer a special program for parents/children who have been attending Mass regularly, who, for whatever reason, have not been participating in the regular Religious Education Program, and who have reached the normal First Communion age. This special program will be four classes with the parents and child and a commitment from the parents to enroll the child in the next Religious Education program. We will soon announce the name of the coordinator and the contact information.
