





Sunday Reflection:

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) January 24, 2010

Neh 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10, Ps 19:8, 9, 10, 15, 1 Cor 12:12-30 or 12:12-14, 27, Lk 1:1-4; 4:14-21 Each Sunday at Mass in my parish, I honor the Gospel book by holding it high before the assembly and carrying it slowly to the ambo, the place where I proclaim the Gospel.

In our first reading today, we witness a similar scene. Ezra the priest opens the scroll of God's law and holds it high for all to see. The people acclaim God present in the Word of God, as they bow low to the ground.

The presence of God in the Word is one of three ways God is present at each Eucharist. We are most familiar with the divine presence in the consecrated bread and wine. God is also present in the gathered assembly. There we're transformed by the Holy Spirit into the Body of Christ, described by Paul in today's second reading.

But back to the first reading: Do we pay attention to God's presence in the Word? Would it be easier if we were in that scene in today's Gospel, to hear Jesus himself read the scroll of Isaiah in the synagogue at Nazareth? Perhaps it's tougher to accept God's presence when it's Jim or Mary or Father Bill doing the reading! But our respect for the Gospel book, our attentive listening, our openness to the Spirit are all crucial to full participation in the Eucharist. Let's allow this Sunday's readings to call us to a renewed response.

St. Joseph School Launches "Cans That Care" Campaign

Inspired by Pastor Sam Loterte, confirmed by a struggling parish food pantry managed by Sr. Ruth Zonunthari, and led by the Saint Joseph School Advisory Board, chaired by Dr. Marlene Hapai, Saint Joseph School starts the new decade with a "Cans That Care" campaign dedicated to helping put food on the tables of those needing this assistance. In October of last year Saint Joseph Church's food pantry had gone from previously serving 30 to 100 families. Today they are servicing 200 families and the need continues to grow. Through this year-round campaign, Board members, students, faculty, and staff have been divided into four groups with each group assigned a specific week of the month to bring in canned goods. On the last day of each week SJS Advisory Board members pick up the food donations and deliver them to the church for distribution. Teacher, Beth Andrade is coordinating the in-school effort.

"As hunger never goes away, this means will ensure a continuous source of food to the church's food pantry," states Chair Hapai. The Saint Joseph School ohana will continue this over the summer and on into the next school year.". Principal, Victoria Torcolini praises these efforts, "In this way, the school can give back to the church that gives so generously to help provide Catholic education to the entire Big Island community. It's a win-win partnership.


