



Sunday Reflection: June 20, 2010 - Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Peter's insight into Jesus' person moved the Lord to warn his disciples of his fate and destiny. He is clear and forthright that suffering, rejection, and death await him. He is equally clear and forthright that on the third day he will rise again! Jesus used this incident as a backdrop to teach about discipleship. To be a disciple is not a soft option, an easy ride, or a guarantee of security. In fact when Christ calls us he bids us to come and die. Disciples are those who freely and willingly wish to be trained or disciplined so as to imitate more closely their master. This is a principle enshrined in most aspects of life — those who aspire to be professional sportsmen or women or learn a trade of skill, understand that to learn, one has to be teachable. Jesus is the Master and he is the One who has taught us that to be a disciple we must deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow him.

It is always good to ask: how can I apply the teaching of Jesus in my life today? Before we address that question it is important to grasp that behind this teaching is a spiritual principle: to gain life is to lose it, to lose life is to gain it. Jesus has taken us into the essence of living a life in the Spirit. Its message has reverberated down through the ages - one cannot be holy unless there is a dying to self, but through that dying, life is gained. How contrary this is to the world's view and — if we are honest - our own view! Dying to our drives, compulsions, and even lusts causes us pain and discomfort. To seek the good of others over and above our own good not only goes against the grain but seems impossible.

Perhaps we only really begin to die to self and live for God when we grasp how impotent and helpless we are against the onslaught of our own selfishness and self-centeredness. To-day will present us with numerous and varied opportunities to die and rise with Christ. What will it mean for me today to die to self and gain life? When the desire to be angry, irritated, or resentful rises up within, cry out to the Lord. Or when the urge to gossip, slander, and speak ill of others takes grip, cry out to the Lord. Or when the drive to be competitive, put others down, and not give the benefit of the doubt occurs, then cry out to the Lord for his grace and proclaim in faith, 'I have been crucified with Christ, it is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me.' http://www.catholic-bible-school.org/reflections-Sunday-readings.html
