Sunday Reflection Father Greg Friedman, O.F.M.

Fifth Sunday of Easter | May 2, 2010

Acts 14:21-27; Ps 145:8-9, 10-11, 12-13; Rv 21:1-5a; Jn 13:31-33a, 34-35

During World War II, my great-uncle in Italy served as a "partisan," a resistance fighter against the Nazis, and he gave his life for that cause. Resistance fighters like him fought throughout occupied Europe. They had to communicate secretly, often in code, as they tried to give hope to their captive brothers and sisters.

On these Easter Sundays, we read from the Book of Revelation. This New Testament work is puzzling, with its strange descriptions and symbolism. Many readers misunderstand its purpose, and try to find involved, often convoluted references to specific events in our own time or the future. But much of Revelation refers to the time in which it was written. Like those resistance fighters in occupied Europe, the early Christians lived through persecution under Roman rule. I like to understand the Book of Revelation as a kind of "resistance literature," a message of hope shared by persecuted Christians. Jesus has triumphed over evil; God's enemies will be defeated, even death itself.

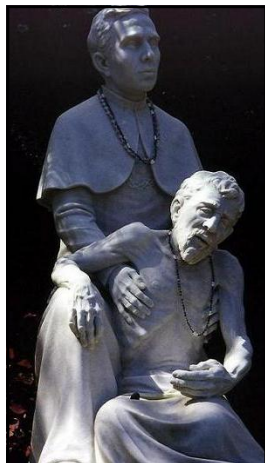
Today, we Christians face our own troubles. We need to hear encouragement, as the Book of Revelation tells us that all will be made new, that death is not the end. It's an ancient message of hope as new as today's dawn.

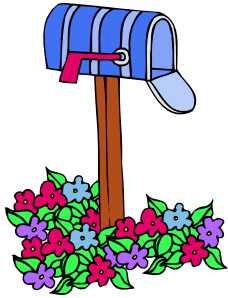
St. Joseph Elementary School is

Dear Parishioners,

First of all, let me thank Fr. Joe Carroll for covering for me while I have been on the mainland for medical monitoring and a retreat. The truth is, if Fr. Carroll wouldn't be available, I'm not sure I could stay at Malia. My oncologist in New York insists that I return twice a year. Fr. Carroll has made this possible and I am deeply appreciative. I am sure that our wonderful parish expresses the same gratitude.

I have finished all my medical tests. I still have leukemia! However, the good news is that it has not progressed in one year. It is stagnant and in remission. There is no indication that it is progressing and becoming life threatening. The doctor is amazed. He stated, "This is a progressive disease. We don't see this in you."

Obviously, I was hoping that the leukemia would be gone. However, Mother Marianne is taking her time.

I am extremely grateful to all of you and to the parishioners of our sister parish, St. Joseph, for your steady prayers. Thanks for your prayers and for putting up with my infirmities. I will be home on Friday, May 7th.

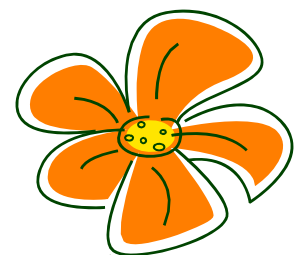

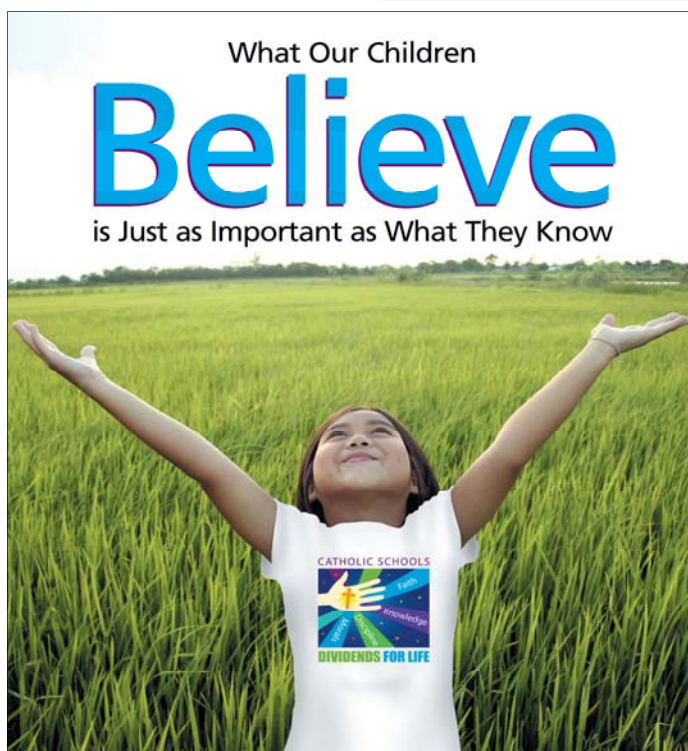

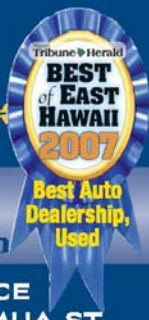
