Sunday Reflection

In his first Rule for the Franciscan Order, St. Francis of Assisi urged his brothers who wished to be missionaries to—in his words—"avoid quarrels or disputes and be subject to every human creature for God's sake." The friars were to be men of peace as they fulfilled Francis's wish to "proclaim the word of God openly." That Franciscan style of mission continues today, as we friars seek to discover where God is at work in different human cultures and in other religious traditions around the world. Today, most contemporary missionaries make a similar effort to look, listen and learn from the people with whom they share the Good News.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends out 72 disciples on mission. He urges them to bring a message of peace as they announce that the Kingdom of God is at hand. We can take a cue as evangelizers in the world today from Christ as St. Francis did. Even if we're not formal missionaries, we're sent out from each Eucharist into the world. We carry a message of peace. Let's seek the good wherever God has planted it. Let's try to learn from those who are different from us, respecting their culture and sincere beliefs, even as we announce the Kingdom.

Grow Strong in Spirit - 2010 Faith Formation Conference

Seven young adult leaders along with Sr. Marykuty and Fr. Gregorio attended the Faith Formation Conference entitled "Grow Strong In Spirit!" It was a four day conference sponsored by the Office for Religious Education which in the words of Bishop Larry Silva, "affords us an opportunity to renew our commitment to learn more about and pass on the wonderful richness of our Catholic



faith: our beliefs, rituals, spiritual traditions, and social teachings." The seven young adult leaders selected courses designed to help train and form them as leaders of the youth and young adult department and in their parishes. They were informed on the practical and theoretical applications of the U.S. Bishops' documents *Renewing the Vision: a Framework for Catholic Youth and Sons & Daughters of the Light: Pastoral Plan to Young Adult Ministry*. The young adults also participated in a class which taught about technology as a new tool for effective catechesis and evangelization. Finally, the entire group listened to Sr. Angie Laurenzo, CSJ, from Maui who spoke about four kinds of relationships: Love, Infatuation, Friendship, and Exploitation.

The organizers and many of the participants were impressed that a neighbor island parish had sent so many young adults who were natural leaders of their ministries. Fr. Gregorio, Sr. Marykuty and the rest of the group agreed that they had gained much from the conference and were anxious to share it with their parish.

We are very happy with our new home and the updating that is being done. Please stop by for a visit when you have time.

St. Joseph Rectory Maintenance updates

If you haven't stopped by the rectory in a while please do so. Fr. Thomas initiated a renovation of the offices when he was pastor and our Maintenance Department along with the help of some volunteers have been working to complete it. The main hallway has new flooring, the walls and ceilings have all been textured and painted, all of the offices have been refurbished and the lighting has been updated with more energy efficient fixtures and soon the reception area will be done. Future plans include renovation of the library and kitchen, repainting of the downstairs meeting room, and then fully repainting the priests living quarters. We will also be addressing the wooden louvers that overlook Kapiolani Street.

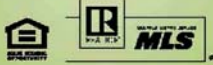

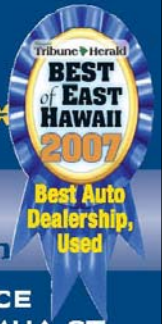
