5th Sunday of Lent: Homelessness and Affordable Housing



On March 19th we celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Joseph was a carpenter or craftsman. Not only did he make tools and furniture out of wood, but he probably built and repaired his own and his neighbors' simple house. Occasionally he may have left his town to work elsewhere on projects that needed skilled laborers like him. In those days, Herod Antipas, the ambitious ruler of Galilee, was constantly constructing new buildings, even new cities, throughout the region and good workers were always in demand. Joseph may even have taken his young Son along to work at his side. St. Joseph (the worker, the carpenter, the craftsman working as a faithful father) served as a role model for Jesus and for all of us.

In today's Gospel story of the Transfiguration, the apostles are dramatically presented with three role models—Jesus, Moses and Elijah. The apostles' immediate response is to propose constructing three tents. Building shelter or dwelling place was a way of recognizing and honoring belonging "*It is good we are here so let's make some tents.*" Providing shelter for dwelling is a way to experience belonging as a gift of God's presence.

We want to take the opportunity of this weekend's Eucharistic celebrations to deepen our understanding of the Diocesan Strategic Plan, **Witness to Jesus—Diocesan Road Map for Pastoral, Program, and Facility Needs (2008-2013)** which made a commitment to address homelessness and the need for affordable housing as one of six priority actions. Since then, there has been a significant, inspiring progress reaching out through charitable services to the homeless in almost every Catholic parish throughout Hawaii.

When the Catholic Church of Hawaii began addressing homelessness as one of the six priority actions of its Diocese Strategic Plan, it was also clear that there is a severe problem of affordable housing throughout the islands. Therefore the Diocesan Office for Social Ministry and Affordable Housing gathered and developed some materials to help parishes understand how we need to move from the darkness of homelessness to the light of affordable housing. *Submitted by: Fr. Dear brothers and sisters,
Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

“On the fifth Sunday, when the resurrection of Lazarus is proclaimed, we are faced with the ultimate mystery of our existence: ‘I am the resurrection and the life....Do you believe this?’ (Jn 11:25-26). For the Christian community, it is the moment to place with sincerity—together with Martha—all of our hopes in Jesus of Nazareth: “Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who has come into the world” (Jn 11:27). Communion with Christ in this life prepares us to overcome the barrier of death, so that we may live eternally with him. Faith in the resurrection of the dead and hope in eternal life open our eyes to the ultimate meaning of our existence: God created men and women for resurrection and life, and this truth gives an authentic and definitive meaning to human history, to the personal and social lives of men and women, to culture, politics and economy. Without the light of faith, the entire universe finishes shut within a tomb devoid of any future, any hope.

The Lenten journey finds its fulfillment in the Paschal Triduum, especially in the Great Vigil of the Holy Night: renewing our baptismal promises, we reaffirm that Christ is the Lord of our life, that life which God bestowed upon us when we were reborn of “water and the Holy Spirit”, and we profess again our firm commitment to respond to the action of the Grace in order to be his disciples.”

With this beautiful reflection of Pope Benedict, I pray that all of us may learn how to live the love of Christ in an ever more radical way.
