#### Pastor's Corner

#### **Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

Our Gospel this Sunday tackles many things worthy of our personal and communal reflection. Let us focus on some lessons we can gain as we live our life in the setting of a parish community.

First. Let us live the virtue of mercy. Mercy is God's greatest attribute. It is not the absence of justice. Rather, it restores whatever has been rendered wrong. Mercy also restores the wrongdoer. Let us, as a parish community, be merciful and just.

Second. Anger is a feeling. But the way we express it can hurt ourselves and others. If we are angry, be angry with something and never with someone. Hate the sin, not the sinner. Let us not allow anger to liquidate us; let us liquidate anger instead. Turn anger into compassion.

Third. We can take the initiative to be reconciled with others. Move toward a sincere reconciliation. Be the first to say, "I'm sorry!" or "I didn't mean to hurt you." Everyday is a time for self-renewal. Everyday is a time for the renewal of our parish community. It is a chance for us to grow in our parish community and with our parish community.

Be merciful and just. Turn anger into compassion. Be the first to reconcile. Be like Jesus. Let us pray:

Teach us how to walk in your footsteps, Jesus, teach us how to walk in your way.

Teach us how to show your love to our neighbor, teach us how to do it today.

Teach us how to break the walls of injustice, teach us how to make a stand.

Teach us how to build a community of peace where love has the upper hand. Amen.


