We will break the fast with Holy Mass celebrated with our own Bishop Larry Silva. Please encourage all teens to participate as this is a beautiful chance to journey with the poor and hungry as a way of living out our Catholic faith.

Rather than retaliating for evil done to us, we are to offer no resistance, hand over our possessions, go the extra mile. Instead of hating our enemies, we are to love them. We are to pray for our persecutors. In short, we're commanded to practice a perfection which imitates the perfection of the Father in heaven.
