Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

We celebrate this month of October World Mission Sunday. This gives us an opportunity to renew our commitment to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to give our pastoral activities here in Saint Joseph Church a greater missionary perspective. As Pope Benedict says in his 2010 message,

"This annual event invites us to live intensely the liturgical and catechetical, charitable and cultural processes through which Jesus Christ summons us to the banquet of his Word and of the Eucharist, to taste the gift of his presence, to be formed at his school and to live ever more closely united to him, our teacher and Lord. He himself tells us, 'He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him' (Jn 14: 21). Only on the basis of this encounter with the love of God that changes life can we live in communion with him and with one another and offer our brothers and sisters a credible witness, accounting for the hope that is in us (cf. 1 Pt 3: 15)."

Pope Benedict in his message also said, "The church invites us to learn from Mary, by praying the Holy Rosary, to contemplate the Father's plan of love for humanity, to love her as he loves her. Is not this also the meaning of mission?"

Mission, therefore, is all about telling God's great love story. All mission is rooted in God's love for us, his plan for our happiness and well-being in this life and the next, eternal life. God has a loving design and this beautiful plan is being unfolded in the lives of many of our ministers, lay leaders and volunteers in our parish community. They continuously give themselves to make God's love known. I wish to thank you for your great and selfless service to our parish. It builds up our ecclesial communion which is the key to mission.

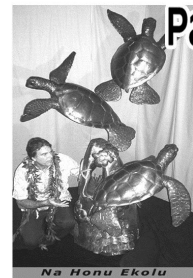
