Pastor's Corner EUCHARIST: Source of all Holiness

Dear bothers and sisters,

Time and again Christians have heard of the centrality of the Eucharist in the pursuit of holiness of life. This is a given truth for many of us. On the other hand it would seem from a previous survey data that about three quarters of people who designate themselves as Catholic never participate in the Eucharist/Mass at all. One ponders in wonder that the Christ present in the Eucharist seems of no great consequence in their lives as Catholics. If, as we believe, the Eucharist is so central to Christian life how can it seem so irrelevant to so many of our fellow Catholics? This is indeed a mystery that baffles adequate explanation.

Moving on from the fact that so many miss out on the riches of the Eucharist, what can be said of those of us who regularly participate in the Mass? No doubt all draw life from the Eucharist, yet do we all receive evermore blessings from the Bread of Life? Christ is the fullness of divine life and love and in every celebration of the Eucharist the immensity and profundity of transforming grace is present, and we are offered 'grace upon grace.'

The celebration of Mass may be likened to a divine wave of love flowing into our midst. Perhaps this could be compared to a huge and limitless reservoir of love seeking to overflow into all hearts that are open and willing to receive its life-giving waters. All who approach the Eucharist desire to be open and willing but feel so inadequate to cope with such copious love. In truth as St. Augustine has said, 'our hearts are restless until they rest in the Lord.' Another author spoke of the awesomeness of being open to the Lord saying, 'lest in having Him I must have nought besides.' One presumes that to open oneself entirely to the Lord is so great and so all-embracing that one tends to shrink or hold back from such a total response to God's love. Conversely we need to realize that in having the Lord we have the fulness of life and love that embraces all creation and all persons made in the image and likeness of God. Did not the Lord say 'seek first the kingdom of heaven and its justice and all other things will be added unto you?'

God's love has called us to a life in which the Eucharist is the source and summit of worship. It remains very much a mystery of faith and calls for prayerful silence and reflection to plumb the depths of the love of the Lord who gives himself entirely in the Eucharist, our Bread of life. Fr. 
