


WELCOME BISHOP LARRY SILVA!

Pastor's Corner

Scripture Readings

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, ... "

Baptize. This is the most important word in the Gospel for this Sunday. St. Paul has a long reflection on baptism. For him, baptism is a sacrament of faith. By faith he means that we now belong to God. Baptism is an event of "belongingness'. It defines to whom we belong. It defines who we are now. When a person is baptized, he/she doesn't belong to him/herself anymore. S/he now belongs to God. Because his/her whole life belongs to God, s/he becomes a beloved son/daughter of God.

It is hard to belong to someone whom we do not know. We don't know everything about God. This is the reason why Jesus also told the disciples, "teach them to observe all that I have commanded you."

Today's feast challenges us to take time and the effort to know God and to have a personal relationship with him so that we can share in his very life and mission. God is our destiny. We all belong to him.

This Saturday Bishop Larry Silva will be here For the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation is the completion of the Sacrament of Baptism. It marks a new stage in the life of the Confirmed. This means that those Confirmed are now ready to make a public declaration of full discipleship in our church's ministry and mission.

I also would like to congratulate those taking their first communion this Sunday. Thank you so much to all of you, to your parents and godparents and to those who prepared you for this important religious events.


