Pastor's Corner

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Scripture Readings

Dear brothers and sisters,

A story is told by a Maryknoll missionary in China about a widow who said she wanted to become a Catholic. He doubted her sincerity at first because many older folks in that area considered the Maryknoll cemetery that overlooked the bay a sacred place to be at rest.

One day he chose to follow her secretly. First she went to the market and bought two oranges and took one to an elderly woman who could no longer get out to shop. Next she went to a pharmacy, and with what little money she had, bought medicine for a dying man. Thus, the day progressed as she continued doing little acts of charity for several people in her fishing village. Her day included a stop at the small Catholic church where the missionary observed her on her knees for more than an hour. Needless to say he felt quite embarrassed about his reluctance to acknowledge her earnestness. This woman, without any formal catechesis, had captured the essence of the Gospel: Love God above all else and love your neighbor as yourself. She was baptized a few weeks later.

We encountered two widows in today's Scriptures—one who met and served Elijah and the other observed by Jesus from a distance. Both gave from what little each had. What they had in abundance, however, was faith.

As people of faith we must work to eradicate from our language the phrases of unbelievers. Phrases like *I can't. I'm too weak. Why me?* or *Get someone else.* If Christ has claimed us as one of his own, then we need to claim him as our one and only Lord. We do this by what we do, day in and day out, not just by what we say in this holy place.

If we spent less time worrying about our place or status in life and more time believing we have the power to make a difference, imagine what might happen. For we do have the ability to make a positive impact on the lives of those we encounter in the course of a week. Begin with those who dwell under the same roof with us because our relationship with Christ has impacted us. We have to believe the world will be blessed, because we will bless it, because we have been blessed in turn by Christ. The world can be different because we will change it; we have been changed by Christ. All things are possible in Christ. For in Christ, we have an abundance of faith. Do we hoard it, or do we share it?
