
Father Charles J. Schmidt, M.M.

Father Charles Schmidt, who served our parish for many of his 55 years on Big Island, was called by the Lord on March 6, 2012 from St. Theresa's, Maryknoll's retirement home in New York. He was a priest for 63 of his 90 years.

Born in Brooklyn in 1921, he was ordained in 1948 and was a missionary in China till the Communist government invited him to leave in 1951.

Providentially, his next assignment was here at St Joseph's where he exhibited his life-long dedication to young people by establishing several youth programs.

He was sent to New York City in 1956 for postgraduate training in education and psychology, followed by stints at St. Benedicts' in Honaunau and at St. John the Bap-



The year 1962 found him again on the Big Island at St. Anthony's in Papaaloa. He remodeled the rectory and parish hall to accommodate the children's RE classes and the newly- founded Boy Scouts.

From 1972-1985 he was pastor of Sacred Heart's in Hawi and built Damien Hall, the gym/social hall for the parish. It was here that a construction accident left him with a life-long limp.

In 1985 he became pastor of Annunciation parish in Kamuela and later moved to Mountain View's St. Theresa Parish where he worked closely with the music minister.

So important were the youth to him that he himself taught the CCD classes in parishes under his care.

Mention must be made of a talent he kept to himself—he was an accomplished pianist who played never to an audience but only for his own relaxation.

He returned full circle in 1993 to St. Joseph's where, as priest in residence he helped wherever he saw the need.

Many were the students helped anonymously by "Father Charlie," who subsidized their tuition. It was he who personally provided the resin chairs for the students in the St. Joseph gym and the folding tables and chairs in the school.

He donated the audiovisual materials in the RE library, and the flowers and shrubs on the school campus. Father counseled students, served as sports chaplain, tutored in Latin, and even coached a student from Spain on the fine points of a hook shot.

Somehow this modest man found the time to tend to the garden between the rectory and the church and even stooped to remove the candle drippings from the church carpet.

Moving to Maryknoll House in Honolulu in 1997, he continued pastoral activities before retiring to St. Theresa's in 2006.
