The winner of that event will take a written test to qualify for the Hawaii State level of the National Geographic Bee in Honolulu in Marchwhere competition will include nearly 2100 students from all around the islands. The state level winner will participate in the National Geographic Bee in Washington, D. C. in May with students from all over the country. Congratulations to all the students who were willing to take a risk and study hard to participate in this fun learning activity.




MASS OF REMEMBERANCE
