Pastor's Corner

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters.

Peace in the Lord Jesus Christ!

The Gospel for this Sunday presents to us the true identity of Jesus: "I know who you are, the holy One of God!" Such declaration came from an unclean spirit that possessed a man in the synagogue. Jesus rebuked the evil spirit sharply and commanded, "Be quiet! Come out of the man!" Jesus was not pleased by the declaration.

In the Gospel of Matthew Peter also made a declaration in response to Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter responded, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus commended Peter for such declaration and he said to him, "Blessed are you Simon son of Jonah. No mere man has revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father."

We have the same declaration of the identity of Jesus: One from an unclean spirit (in this Sunday's Gospel) and the other from Peter (c/o Mt 16: 16). But the same declaration received a different response from Jesus. Why? Because the unclean spirit made a declaration of fact. Peter made a declaration of faith. The evil spirit cannot avoid the fact that Jesus is the Son of God. Peter made a declaration of faith. His answer was borne out of love and out of a personal encounter with Jesus.

When we gather together for the Sunday Mass we declare and profess our faith in the living God. May we do so out of love for him.

As we observe Catholic Schools Week may we continue to support Catholic Education as an integral part of the Church's mission.
