Voter Registration Deadlines:

Primary Election: July 10, 2014 General Election: October 6, 2014

If you are registering to vote, your application must be postmarked to the City or County Clerk where you reside by the dates

specified above.



Permanent Absentee Deadlines:

Primary Election: August 2, 2014, 4:30 p.m. General Election: October 28, 2014, 4:30 p.m.

If you are applying to receive absentee ballots permanently, your application must be received by the City or County Clerk where you reside no later than the dates specified above.

Notice to First Time Voters Who Register to Vote by Mail:

If you are (1) registering to vote for the first time in the State of Hawai'i; and (2) are mailing in this Application for Voter Registration, federal law (42 U.S.C. § 15483) requires you to provide proof of identification. Proof of identification includes a copy of:

- A current and valid photo identification, or
- A current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows your name and address.

If you do not provide the required proof of identification with this Application for Voter Registration, you will be required to do so at your polling place, or with your voted absentee mail-in ballot.

Who May Register to Vote? You may register to vote if you are:

- A citizen of the United States of America;
- A legal resident of Hawaii; and
- At least 18 years of age.

We just celebrated our Independence Day last Friday, the first Friday of the month, also dedicated in honor of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. We pray that all Ameicans may truly love our country by imitating the love of Jesus for us.

In our gospel, Jesus praises the Father for revealing "these things" to the little ones. What is revealed is everything that the Father has given to the Son. Who knows the Father? Only the Son. How to Register to Vote?



By Mail: Mail in voter registration form is widely available. Mail the Wikiwiki Voter Registration & Permanent Absentee form to the Office of the City or County Clerk where you reside. In Person: Visit the Office of the City or County Clerk where you reside to complete a Wikiwiki Voter Registration & Permanent Absentee form. Department of Motor Vehicle: The State of Hawaii Application for Motor Vehicle Driver's License also contains a Motor Voter Affidavit on Application for Voter Registration allowing any individual to simultaneously apply for a driver's license and register to vote.

5. Weigh other issues properly.

There are many issues that have to be considered in elections, but as we have already seen, *not all have equal weight*. Once voters have disqualified those candidates who violate fundamental principles, they need to look at the wide spectrum of issues affecting the proper care of human life and promotion of human dignity.

The US Bishops mention these issues in <u>Living the Gospel of Life</u> and it declares, "Any politics of human life must work to resist the violence of war and the scandal of capital punishment. Any politics of human dignity must seriously address issues of racism, poverty, hunger, employment, education, housing, and health care. Therefore, Catholics should eagerly involve themselves as advocates for the weak and marginalized in all these areas.

But being 'right' in such matters can never excuse a wrong choice regarding direct attacks on innocent human life. Indeed, the failure to protect and defend life in its most vulnerable stages renders suspect any claims to the 'rightness' of positions in other matters affecting the poorest and least powerful of the human community. If we understand the human person as the "temple of the Holy Spirit" -- the living house of God -- then these latter issues fall logically into place as the crossbeams and walls of that house.
