

Aloha Choir: Ministry in Song for Those in Bereavement

"If one member suffers in the body of Christ, which is the Church, all the members suffer with that member" (1 Corinthians 12:26)

When a member of Christ's Body dies, the faithful are called to a ministry of consolation to those who have suffered the loss of one whom they love. The Church calls each member of Christ's body--priest, deacon, layperson-to participate in the ministry of consolation: to care for the dying, to pray for the dead, to comfort those who mourn.

For nearly a "quarter of a century", the Aloha Choir (St. Joseph Church, Hilo) has brought comfort and strength to grieving families through their ministry in singing songs along with the assembly which is expressive of the texts and at the same time simple and easily sung. Music allows the community to express convictions and feelings that words alone may fail to convey. It has the power to console and uplift the mourners and to strengthen the unity of the assembly in faith and love. "Blessed are they who mourn, they shall be consoled" (Matthew 5:3)

The Aloha Choir was founded by a parishioner, Lorina Springer, in the 1980's who was bothered so much because "some funerals would have loads of people with hired musicians. Others were totally empty, nothing uplifting about it at all." With the help of the parish pastor, they recruited volunteers just for funerals. After many years along with changes in members and leadership, the Aloha Choir is still present today to carry on a legacy of serving families in bereavement through the gift of song. Also, the current organist is Michael Springer, son of Lorina Springer—family tradition carries on.


