All Saints Day

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace!

In his book Jesus of Nazareth, Pope Emeritus Benedict, writes that the Beatitudes are the fruit of Jesus' gaze upon the disciples. Jesus sees them as poor, hungry, weeping, hated, and persecuted. Yet this condition also becomes a promise when seen from the perspective of God. Yes, the Beatitudes are paradoxes because they contain God's values.

Says Benedict, "It is precisely those who are poor in worldly terms, those thought as lost souls, who are truly fortunate ones, the blessed, who have every reason to rejoice and exult in the midst of their sufferings. The Beatitudes are promises resplendent with the new image of the world and of man inaugurated by Jesus, his 'transformation of values'. They are eschatological promises."

As we observe the Solemnity of All Saints, let us remember the many men and women of all time who were the portraits of Jesus in their own lifetime. Like them, let us follow their example of faithfulness and loving service.

Our Parish Pastoral Plan, Goal 3 under the Pillar of Service reminds us that all parishioners can help by "Promoting the restoration of human dignity and giving a sense of hope to individuals and families we serve."

THE COMMUNIONOF SAINTS:

They pray for us.....The Saints

All Saints Day (November 1), the day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints,



known and unknown, is a surprisingly old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored.

"The Communion of Saints is made up of all men [and women] who have placed their hope in Christ and belong to him through Baptism, whether they have already died or are still alive. Because in Christ we are one Body; we live in communion that encompasses heaven and earth." (YouCat #146; CCC#946-962)

The Church is larger and more alive than we think. Among her members are the living and the deceased (whether they are still undergoing a process of purification or are already in the glory of God), individuals known and unknown, great saints and inconspicuous persons. We can help one another even beyond the grave. We can call on patrons and favorite saints, but also our departed relatives and friends whom we believe are already with God. Conversely, by our intercessory prayer, we can come to the aid of our dear departed who still are undergoing purification. Whatever the individual does or suffers in and for Christ benefits all. Conversely, this unfortunately means also that every sin harms the communion. (YouCat #146).

And we pray for them.....The Souls

Often overshadowed by the two days preceding it, Halloween and All Saints Day, *All Souls Day (November 2)* is a solemn feast in the Roman Catholic Church commemorating all of those who have died and now are in Purgatory, being cleansed of their venial sins and the temporal punishments for the mortal sins that they had confessed and atoning before entering fully into Heaven.

The term, purgatory, still exists in church literature today (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1030-1032) despite the fact that it is not mentioned in the Bible. Two New Testament verses allude to a cleansing fire (1 Corinthians 3:15 and 1 Peter 1:7), and they have served as the basis for the concept of purgatory, which evolved from the fifth to 13th centuries. Consistent with this ancient Jewish practice, the Catholic Church has taught for centuries that our prayers serve as an aid to those who have died, and the premier prayer to offer for their intention is the Eucharist, the holy sacrifice of the Mass. The church also recommends almsgiving, indulgences and other works of penance for the deceased (Catechism, No. 1032). On this All Souls Day or any time throughout the month of November, please consider reserving some time to pray for the dead. 
