# Third Sunday of Advent

# Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families: by Barbara Matera; 2015

Reflecting on the Word—John the Baptist gives this concrete example of how to repent and turn toward the Lord: A person with two cloaks should give one away. In those times, a cloak was the outer garment that kept away the chill not only during the day but also at night. To follow Jesus means to throw off what we do not need and to share with others. The prophet Zephaniah speaks of the Christ as one "cloaked in justice". Why does Jesus wear such a cloak? Can he share it with others?

Living the Word-During these winter months, someone somewhere is cold. Look in your closets for coats or jackets that no longer fit or are not needed. Donate them to a coat drive or to the Parish Social Ministry. As you work on this project, have a conversation about why our Baptism calls us to look out for other people. Explain that Baptism calls us to holiness and that as holy people we are to care for each other. You could ask the children of your family other ways they have looked out for others as school or at other activities.


