What is JUSTICE?

Justice along with prudence, temperance and fortitude has been identified by the Church as one of the four cardinal virtues, meaning it is something we acquire over the long haul by constantly practicing it. It is essentially a GOOD HABIT. Scriptural references to persons of justice teach us that what sets a just person apart is "habitual right thinking" and upright conduct towards one's neighbor (CCC#1807).

What can you do? Take Action, Start Today:

It has been a really hot summer and many individuals are suffering from heat exhaustion. Many families have school aged children who are sitting in the same classrooms and playing on the playgrounds as our own children. They may or may not have the proper supplies such as reusable water bottles to keep them hydrated while in school or at play.


