

April is Safe Environment Awareness:

TECHNOLOGY CAN BE SUCH A GREAT MEANS to connect people

across distances and to share information with others. It also is a way to make busy lives a little more efficient and convenient. However, technology can also be a means for your child to encounter things that are harmful to them. There are individuals in the

them. There are individuals in the world who intend to harm others especially the most vulnerable like young people. The internet does not have to be a horrible experience for families but parents need to be aware of how much of the internet your child is exposed to.

Tips:

- Parents, always know what your child and/or teen are being exposed to through the internet. Look for yourselves.
- Set boundaries and limits to keep your child away from the internet, including social media sites & apps.
- Talk with them about how to keep themselves safe.
- Help them to know what could be hurtful to them and how to decipher who or what information to trust online.
- Reassure them that they need to come to you if they are not sure about what they experience online.


