
# First Sunday of Advent

The exchange between Jesus and Pilate in today's Gospel is, arguably, the most important exchange in all of literature. Pilate asks Jesus: "What have you done?" Jesus replies that he testifies to the truth. In the second reading we are reminded of the essence of that truth: Christ, ruler of all, loves us, liberates us from the bonds of sin, makes us a new kingdom. As we approach the Advent season, this week would be a good time to reflect on the question: What have we done in our daily lives, in our actions, words, private prayer, and in our interaction with others, to testify that Jesus is Lord?

# Merciful like the Father

# Jubilee of Mercy

"May the coming Jubilee of Mercy encourage families everywhere to rediscover the power of

forgiveness." Pope Francis
The Jubilee of Mercy was announced by Pope Francis as a year to be lived intensely in each particular Church, allowing every person to encounter the mercy of God the Father through diligent labor for the Church's mission there. The most evident sign of this pastoral care is the chance to open a Door of Mercy in every diocese. These doors, analogous to the Holy Doors of the Papal Basilicas in Rome, will permit even people who cannot travel to Rome to make a Jubilee pilgrimage.

Having Crossed the Doorway

Once they have crossed through the Holy Door or Door of Mercy, or have fulfilled one of the other

conditions

under which Pope Francis has granted the Jubilee Indulgence (for example, for the sick, for the imprisoned, or for anyone who carries out in person a work of mercy), in addition to the usual conditions which require a heart well-disposed for the grace to bring its desired fruits, the faithful should stop in prayer to fulfill the final actions asked for: the profession of faith, and prayer for the Holy Father and his intentions. The latter should be at least an "Our Father" - the prayer in which Jesus himself taught us to turn as children to the Father but it could possibly be more. In particular, taking into consideration the spirit of this Holy Year, it is suggested that pilgrims recite the lovely prayer of Pope Francis

for the Jubilee, and that they conclude the time of pray

er with an invocation to the merciful Lord Jesus (for example, "Merciful Jesus, I trust in You").

# **Prayer of Pope Francis for the Jubilee**

Lord Jesus Christ,

you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father,

and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him.

Show us your face and we will be saved.

Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money;

the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things;

made Peter weep after his betrayal,

and assured Paradise to the repentant thief.

Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman:

"If you knew the gift of God!"

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

We ask this of you, Lord Jesus, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy; you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever.

Amen.

# FEED THE HUNGRY

"At first I was afraid of how a homeless person on the street looks, but after today, I don't feel as scared", were the comments many teens shared after this event. The parish youth ministry distributed 85+ bags of PB & J sandwiches to individuals found on



the streets on Saturday, November 21 around downtown Hilo, stopping at Kalakaua Park, Lincoln Park and Mohea Bus terminal and Bandstand. Mario Miguel, the parish social minister, escorted about 20 young people during their weekly youth ministry gathering. All the donations for this event were by the teens' families themselves. When the teens returned, they had a brief discussion about their observations, their experiences and their feelings. The teens learned the difference between Justice and Mercy.



They identified different areas where they could show their mercy to others. Chrislyn Villena introduced the upcoming theme for the new liturgical year, "Merciful like the Father". Mario thanked them for their compassion and expressed how proud he was of them and that this was a great start to being good stewards of God's creation. **Some teens shared their thoughts and comments:** 

- "I feel so happy and excited and proud of myself for doing something good for God's people," said one of the teens.
- Another teen commented saying, "I was a little nervous as to how certain individuals may act towards us but after this event, I see that they are just people who need to be cared for".
- "My favorite part of this activity was when each person didn't rush up to take the bags from us but waited for us to hand it to them and they smiled and said, 'thanks/thank you' to each of us," said one of the teen council members.
- One of the teens in the confirmation class mentioned, "I want to do this again and I want to make more bags and have more people my age to join us. It feels so good and people should feel what we did, too."
- "I loved how all the people were so excited to see Uncle Mario and us [the group of teens]," said a young boy in the youth ministry.

Thank you to the parish teen council for organizing this event and a special thank you to Mario Miguel for spending time with the teens.

# FAMILY ADVENT ACTIVITY: BLESS YOUR ADVENT WREATH

You will need a Bible and four candles to celebrate this blessing. Before your family has gathered for the blessing, select one of the following Scripture passages to be read during the blessing: <u>Isaiah 11:1-4</u>, <u>61:1-2</u>; <u>Mark 1:1-8</u>; <u>James 5:7-10</u>; or <u>Philippians 4:4-7</u>. Have someone volunteer to read the passage.

Place the Advent wreath on a table and have your family gather around it. Lower the light level in the room to create an appropriate atmosphere for the blessing. Place the four candles (symbolizing the four weeks of Advent) on the table and light a single candle for the first week of Advent. Have someone lead your family in the following prayer.

**Leader:** This week we begin the season of Advent, when the days grow short and darkness closes in. We are preparing to celebrate at Christmas the birth of Jesus, who is the light of the world. Let's spend some quiet time being aware of the darkness and longing for the light. (Pause a few moments and then pray the Sign of the Cross.)

**Leader:** Lord God, bless this wreath and bless us as well. May this wreath remind us of the hope and joy that Jesus brings into the world. We ask this through Christ our Lord. All: Amen.

**Leader:** *Advent* means "arrival." In the season of Advent, the church prepares to celebrate the coming of Jesus. We recall the past, celebrate the present, and look to the future with hope. We prepare to celebrate not only the birth of Jesus but also his presence in our family. We wait for the return of the Lord at the end of time when all hopes will be fulfilled. We await the coming of the light that will shine in the darkness, shining light on our path to peace.

**Reader:** A reading from [name of book in Bible]. (Reader reads selected passage.)

**Leader:** The Word of the Lord. **All:** Thanks be to God.

All: Amen. (Pray the Lord's Prayer.)
