Fr. Foli's Weekly Reflection

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time:

"Lord, Increase our faith!"

Faced with great problems or challenges, from where or whom do you draw strength?

Today we hear the disciples' request, "Increase our faith." But what is faith? Faith, in the context of our day to day problems, is that which makes us reach out to God's hand so that He will be our light, our strength and our savior. Perhaps our faith may be smaller than the already small mustard seed, i.e. it is not big enough to move mountains. But it should be just enough to enable us to reach out to God's hand so that He will help us walk up the mountains of problems confronting us. To have faith is to acknowledge our inadequacies as we surrender ourselves entirely in God's hands.

But let us not forget that even if we put our trust in the Lord, we still have to do our part. Putting our future in the hands of God is to not expect Him to rain down food from heaven or dissipate every storm that is coming. Rather, He wants us to do our share — we have to work to bring food to our table and prepare for the storm. The same goes with our problems. As we ask God's help, we also have to help ourselves cope with them. And with God's grace, we are enabled to overcome them or anything else that comes our way.

A writer once said that amidst our various problems, we ask why God is not doing anything. In truth, he said, it is God who is asking us: "Why are YOU not doing anything at all?" In other words, God helps those who help themselves. Do we?

RESTORING THE ORIGINAL ORDER OF SARCRAMENTS OF INI-TIATION

In January of 2016, with the approval of Bishop Larry Silva, the Diocese of Honolulu officially began the process of restoring the Sacraments of Initiation to their original order: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

St. Joseph Catholic Community begins our transition plan to move our parish and our parochial school into the restoring the original order of sacraments. Our plan seeks to model the diocese as well as address the faith formation goals in the 2015-2020 parish plan.

We will establish new programs, build upon existing processes and sustain the natural patterns families follow as people of faith. We will be offering many more opportunities for stewardship during this time as well as encouraging families to take a more primary role in evangelizing to each other as well as to their community.

We will bridge the gap between various generations and small Christian communities by providing faith formation learning centers that meet the spiritual needs of the whole family.
