Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli

2nd Sunday of Advent:

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand"

Today's gospel opens with a stern reminder from John the Baptist, who will be our guide during this advent season, for the need to "repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand". But why repent?

The Greek word for "repent" is *Metanoia*, which means a complete change of mind and heart. We need to open our mind, our heart, in fact our whole life for the Kingdom. The Kingdom does not appear out of the blue. It will not come automatically. God will bring about the realization of this via people. This will unfold for us only when certain conditions are met — when we are converted to a new style of life and are willing to commit ourselves to banish injustice either personal or societal and ready to welcome each other as brothers and sisters. In this, Kingdom is imminent. Thus, whether the Kingdom will indeed be a living reality depends on each one of us, that is, whether we are willing to be transformed and experience transformation by the love and presence of God in our lives.

And this is what advent teaches and helps us prepare. Advent invites us to enter the sacred space of encounter with God so that if we are quiet in our hearts long enough, we will discover the God still carves out highways and turns the desert places of our lives into oases of wonder, life, beauty, even though nothing will be as we expected. "Joy to the World. Let every heart prepare Him room." is what we shall be singing come Christmas but meantime we have to ask ourselves: Are we really seriously preparing a room for Him in our hearts – in our lives?

Simbang Gabi or Misa de Gallo-Part 1 of 3

For Filipino Catholics, the tradition of Simbang Gabi is the nine-days of novena Masses celebrated before Christmas. The Simbang Gabi tradition grew out of a practice brought by the Spaniards, who held Masses known as Misas de Aguinaldo or Misas de Gallo in December in the pre-dawn hours for field laborers in honor of the Annunciation. The tradition was discontinued in Spain and most of the rest of the world but is a vibrant practice among Filipino Catholics. Hence, this celebration is also known by is popular Spanish name as the misa de gallo, or "mass of the rooster". Catholic churches throughout the Philippines will be ringing their bells around 3:00 or 3:30 in the morning long before the roosters crow.
