Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli 4th Sunday of Advent:

"All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said..."

Today the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We light the last candle on our Advent wreath and our preparation for Christmas is almost finished. In the gospel we have Matthew drew the connection of the virgin birth of Jesus with the prophecy of Isaiah that says: 'Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,' which means 'God is with us." But this would mean the participation of man in the unfolding of God's plan. And together with Mary, God will call upon Joseph as He would call upon all of us to participate in his divine plan. But the big question is, will we be ready to give up our own well planned project in life, if only to be part of the plan of God?

Referring to St. Joseph, Pope Francis reflected: "He was following a good life plan, but God had kept a different design for him, a greater mission. Joseph was a man who always listened to the voice of God, profoundly amenable to God's secret will, a man attentive to the messages that came from the depths of the heart and from above,"

We may wonder how Joseph was able to let go of his plans and take on this new direction of his life. The answer is simple: he was willing to place himself completely at the disposal of God — as Mary did with her "fiat" ("Be it done to me"). They were willing to entrust their life and future to God. But little did they know that with their self-surrender, it is the future of the whole human race that was at stake. But even then, it does not mean that because Joseph and Mary chose to follow God's will that their path will be easy. They will have their share of trials and difficulties. But holding on to the vision, this is where they drew their strength. Like Joseph, each one of us has a mission from God. And our Yes to God's plan is part of the continuing work of redemption not only for ourselves but for the whole of humanity as well.

As we continue our preparation for the birthday of Jesus during Advent, let us pray for light to discover God's mission for us. And upon its discovery, let us place our trust totally in God as we do our best to carry it out — as Mary and Joseph did. Definitely there will be obstacles along the way. But with God on our side, we, too, will triumph in the end.
