Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Dear brothers and sisters,

Peace!

It is Palm Sunday. It is a Sunday that we have our palms blessed. This is a day to help us prepare for the holy week.

In our first reading we see a Suffering Servant who embraces suffering out of obedience to God's word. It is an obedience that also let him to trust solely in God.

The Suffering Servant teaches us the capacity to bear suffering as a consequence of our obedience to the will of God. He teaches us to bear the suffering out of trust in God.

The suffering of Jesus led to his gruesome humiliation and death on the cross. He suffered a lot in the hands of his enemies even if he is innocent of the charges that he was accused of. In the prelude to today's great Passion Narrative, Saint Paul reminds us that we find our hope in the "emptiness" and "humility" of Christ Jesus; a life that led to the cross, but through the cross, to glory and exaltation. The way is not easy. Good stewards know that it requires a willingness to lay aside all rights of personal privilege; emptying ourselves in the service of others; embracing values different from the values of the world. It requires an understanding that to be "in Christ" means to be a servant because Christ came into the world, not as Lord but as servant. What crosses are we willing to carry? What worldly values are we willing to forego in order to share Christ's glory?


