<u>Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli</u>

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

"The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds" (Sirach 35:17).

A basic desire of man is his desire for God. As the prophet Isaiah reminds: "Seek the Lord while he may be found . Call on him while he is near". For is it not true that when we have God we have everything? And where do we encounter God if not in our PRAYER.

But what really is prayer? And how do we know when we are truly praying?

The Gospel gives us a clue. Is our prayer and our way of praying like that of the Pharisee or that of the Publican. The Pharisee was reporting his accomplishments. He was the source of his own "spiritual success". He justified himself. On the other hand, the Publican acknowledged his need for God. And the Gospel says, "I tell you, the latter went home justified, the other did not." One prayed with his ego, the other prayed with a humble heart.

The prayer that comes from a heart that is humble acknowledges that everything we are and have came from God. And if we fall into sin, it is not solely because of human weakness but also because of our failure to run to God for help. In other words, we are saved not because of our own merit but because of God's mercy. This is what the Pharisee and we often forget but which the prayer of the tax collector was able to capture. Thus even if He only asked for mercy, he ended up justified before God.

There are many occasions that bring us to prayer. There are many ways of praying. There is however one common denominator of prayer that is pleasing to God. We approach God humbly and lovingly.




