Weekly Reflection from Fr. Poli

"Today a Savior has been born to you, He is Christ the Lord."

Merry Christmas to all of you, friends and parishioners of St. Joseph Church.

But what is the true essence of Christmas? Why celebrate it year after year. It is a recurring question. It is a question posed every Christmas season.

True we can right away respond that Christmas commemorates the birth of Jesus. But so what? What difference does this celebration of the birth of a child make in our life and in the life of a church like ours if not for the whole humanity.

I believe the answer lies in the heart of the Christmas narrative itself. Both in the gospel of Matthew and Luke is a simple verity. That there is a people who for long period of time has awaited the fulfillment of God's promise that one day He will come and put an end to all their sufferings and fill their longings. But contrary to their expectations and just when they did not expect it, God came and became human like us and dwelt in our midst.

I believe that the true essence of Christ becoming human is about possibility in the midst of the impossible. Nothing will stop Him from taking every opportunity even how seemingly impossible to reveal His love for His creatures. It is likewise a possibility that humanity, itself, is caught unprepared for the simplicity of its manifestation that man is wondering how could it be. How is it that God will come as a helpless child when the world is expecting a warrior king that brings with him riches and power? If only to invite us time and again to remember that man's way is certainly not God's way. Thus leading us to hold on to Him even when everything seems bleak and cold. There is hope for He is hope.

What is born therefore is not just hope, which is just a mere wishful thinking that things will get better when they cannot. Rather it is hope that has taken on a human flesh and born amongst men, a hope that has assumed a human face and held in a mother's arms, a hope that endures and will endure suffering and death itself. It is the hope, the possibility, that arises from trivial and impossible beginnings, infused with the power of God through the Holy Spirit, that has become into a light to all nations.

It is this possibility, this God, that we celebrate at Christmas. Christmas therefore, awakens that profound memory within us of the God who became a child that gave the world the hope that it longed for. A memory that continues to inspire us to believe in that hope and to make that hope alive in our midst.

A blessed and hope-filled Christmas to all.



Religious Education Family Ministries:


The families of the Religious Education Sunday Classes gathered on December 18 for their Advent Parent Fellowship. They began with a

Liturgical Notes for the Diocese of Honolulu 2017

As many of you know, many years ago an indult was granted by the Holy See to the Diocese of Honolulu to reduce the number of Holy Days of Obligation to two: the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (December 8-Patroness of the USA) and Christmas (December 25). After a discussion of the Presbyteral Council in the Fall of 2016, it was decided to leave the current practice in place, but to encourage the faithful to attend mass on the other Holy Days of Obligation celebrated in the United States of America. Pastors and Liturgical leaders are asked to provide practical opportunities for more people to attend mass on these days by celebrating what is convenient for the faithful.

The parish will provide a schedule of masses for particular Holy Days of Obligation for the 2017 based on the Liturgical calendar and the preference of the pastor.
