<u> Pastor's Corner from Fr. Wilbert</u>

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Joseph,

The grace and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all!

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus is a reminder for us that faith is not enough without works. It is our Catholic identity that faith and works will always go together. To make this a reality, I would like to revisit the stewardship which was initiated by my predecessor.

I'm pretty sure you have been hearing the word "STEWARDSHIP." The main reference of stewardship is the Bible. It is not a program but a way of life where parishioners have an opportunity to actively participate in our parish.

I was so curious about it until I found out the good results from other parishes across the nation. When I attended the Stewardship Conference together with Bishop Larry Silva and some other priests and lay leaders from the Diocese of Honolulu last August 24-25 in Wichita, Kansas, I felt the need to embrace stewardship in our parish as a tool to enhance our vibrant community. Initially we are organizing our existing ministries and committees into four pillars: Hospitality, Formation, Prayer and Service. In this way we can identify our strength and weaknesses as a parish.

Some of our parishioners have participated in seminars and workshops regarding stewardship. We have formed a Stewardship Committee to assist me for the implementations. In fact, Fr. Zaldy will be attending the International Catholic Stewardship Con-ference in New Orleans on October 2^{nd} to 5^{th} this year. One of the key components toward successful stewardship is your active participation in our parish. We laid out different ministries so that you can select one that you are comfortable with. We are inviting those with potentials and skills to share their time and talents with the church. Right now we are planning to create and revitalize ministries to take care of the needs of our parish especially our temporal goods. Most of our ministries focused on spiritual goods of the church while our temporal goods have been taken for granted. Thus, we are reactivating the Building and Construction Committee. Their primary role is to take care for construction, repair and maintenance in the church. Aside from that, we are anticipating a grand celebration of our 100 years anniversary of our church in 2019. We need a committee to plan out all the activities related to the centennial celebration. Mr. Harvey Motomura took the lead and now we need more volunteers. Should you be interested to join the committee, please drop by the Parish Office on Monday through Friday, 8:00am – 4:00pm.
