Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you.

Matthew 21:31

"A man had two sons."

The parable this Sunday might seem to pose the question of "Who was really the good son?" or "What does it take to be a good son?" Is he the one who said Yes but did not go or the one who said No but went later on? Of course, we all will say, the good son is the one who actually went and did what the Father asked. For while both sons disobeyed their father - one repented and then did what the father told him. The other was only good with his words and not his action.

For as the saying goes, "Actions speak louder than words." When there is action, there is no need for words. So when we do not do what we say, as in the case of the second son, our words lose credibility. Our words will mean nothing if they are not accompanied by actions. Worse, our words lose their value when our actions contradict them. Nobody will believe our words anymore just as shown in the example of many of the Pharisees and Scribes in the gospel.

But the parable is not complete if we forget the Father and do not place Him in the center. And to the Father, the question "who is the good son?' does not make sense because they are both his sons. But if we ask Him, "whom does he love more?" And I am sure we all will hear him say, He loves them both unconditionally.

God's desire is for the conversion of our hearts reflected in our speech and our actions that we know, respect and follow His will. And if ever, God desires that we follow the example not of the first, nor the second, but of His Only True Son - the one who said "yes" and obeyed the will of the heavenly Father even unto death. He is Jesus Christ.

So do you desire to be the Good Son or to be the Beloved Son of the Father?

Dear Friends of the Diocese of Honolulu,

Peace be with you! Earlier this year our Hawaii State Legislature considered a bill that would allow physician assisted suicide in our beloved State (euphemistically called "Compassion in Choices"). I asked you to stand up for life, and you responded overwhelmingly. One media source even "blamed" the Catholic Church for the death of the bill. Thank you for being instrumental in convincing the Legislature not to pass the proposed bill! You took to heart Jesus' often spoken words, "Be not afraid!" and in love proclaimed the truth of the value of all life from the moment of conception until natural death. While we thank God that legislation was not passed in the last session, we anticipate the issue will be presented again. Moreover, there are many other areas where the sanctity of human life is threatened, and these will continue to call for our vigilance and our courage in speaking out cogently and lovingly

as the voice of those who cannot speak for themselves, such as the unborn. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated October as "Respect Life Month," a month in which we take time to educate ourselves on the issues of life and how we can be instruments of preserving life and enhancing the dignity of each person. Resources have been provided to each parish, and we pray that our commitment to the sanctity of life will be renewed and strengthened during these days, so that our prayer and study will bear much good fruit throughout the year.

"Be not afraid" to embrace life, and to continue to be good stewards by using the gift of your education, your vote, and your voice

to enshrine the sanctity of every human life in every heart and every one of our institutions.


