As we become salt and light to others, let us not forget to do so for the reason the gospel tell us: "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." The good works we do should not only reflect but also point to the Source of all goodness — God Himself. Then seeing our good works, others may glorify the heavenly Father, too.
