Weekly Reflection: 19th Sunday of Ordinary Time - Year A "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

In the first place, why did Peter ask Our Lord to let him walk on the water?

The only response that I could think of is for the same reason why people in Hawaii love to surf - a sense of conquest, a sense of doing what is seemingly impossible. True, taking the story literally, then the miracle might seem to have no relevance for us. But as a faith story, could it be at some time in our being a disciple of the Lord, He will ask us to do something which from a human point of view is either ridiculous, utterly disconcerting, or simply impossible.

We all at some time or another have been confronted by very frustrating circumstances, very great burdens, very tempting dilemmas. From a human point of view to do the Christian thing, seems to make no sense, if not totally impossible given our human limitations. During these moments we might just be ask to "walk on the water". The solid ground vanishes from beneath our feet and what we normally hold on as our security is taken away. It is then that we have to rely on Christ – His Spirit, His Love, His Word. Being a disciple of Christ is walking in faith, that is, a relying only on the Spirit, the Word, the unconditional Love of Christ for us

But focusing on the person of Christ is not always easy. Fear in its many forms can easily creep in the way fear of the waves took hold of Peter and thus, he began to sink. And the same is true for us, fear has the ability to take away from us the miracles that God wants to do in us, and through us. Fear makes us unstable, unsure and distrusting of God's unconditional love and concern for us.

Thus, we have just to hear the words of Jesus again and hold on to it: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."
